THE LIVES OF POOR WHITE PEOPLE


Chief grew up poor, in the Rust Belt, in an Ohio steel town that has been hemorrhaging jobs and hope for as long as I can remember." That's how J. D. Vance begins one of this campaign season's saddest and most fascinating books, "Hillbilly Elegy: A Memoir of a Family and Culture in Crisis" (Harper). Vance was born in Kentucky and

raised by his grandparents, as a self-described "hillbilly," in Middletown, Ohio, home of the once-mighty Armco Steel. His family struggled with poverty and domestic violence, of which he was a victim. His mother was addicted to drugs—first to painkillers, then to heroin. Many of his neighbors were jobless and on welfare. Vance escaped their fate by joining the Marines and serving in Iraq. Afterward, he attended Ohio State and Yale Law School, where he was mentored by Amy Chua, the law professor and tiger mom. He now lives in San Francisco, where he works at Mithril Capital Management, the investment firm helmed by Peter Thiel. It seems safe to say that Vance, who is now in his early thirties, has seen a wider swath of America than most people.

In 2016, Harper published JD's book, Hillbilly Elegy, in which he described his life and hardships, and the socioeconomic problems of his hometown. The book was very successful, and it was even adapted into a shitty Netflix movie. It also made JD famous.






During this time, JD had also moved to San Francisco to work as a venture capitalist in the tech industry, even (allegedly) working for Elon Musk's and David Sacks' old buddy, Peter Thiel in his firm Mithril Capital between 2016 and 2017.





But Vance had higher ambitions, and for those he had to move back to Ohio. First, he launched a non-profit organization that was supposed to focus on education, addiction, and other socioeconomic issues he had described in his book. The organization closed down just two...

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
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In a 2016 interview with NPR, Vance said he was leaving the Bay Area to return to Ohio and do nonprofit work to target opioid addiction that was prevalent in his community growing up. "It's obviously very personally important to me and it's something my family has struggled with and dealt with," he said on NPR's All Things Considered. "And I felt, you know, frankly a little bit of responsibility now that I've been given this platform by the success of the book to go and try to do at least a little something to help out."

Vance used his platform to start Our Ohio Renewal, a 501(c)(4) advocacy organization that focused on education, addiction and other "social ills" he mentioned in his memoir. The organization shuttered in less than two years with few accomplishments.

...years after its launch with very few accomplishments. In 2022, JD's rival Tim Ryan claimed that the NGO was a front for his political ambitions, and later Business Insider reported that it had spent more



A <u>review by Insider</u> of the nonprofit's tax filings showed that in its first year, Our Ohio Renewal spent more on "management services" provided by its executive director Jai Chabria — who also serves as Vance's top political advisor — than it did on programs to fight opioid abuse.


And Vance's old friend Peter Thiel also chipped in - he put a staggering 15 million USD into JD's campaign to run for senator in 2022. Thiel had previously financed Vance's venture firm Narya Capital that later helped fund the "alt-right" video platform Rumble.





As most of you have noticed, Vance has been a pretty bad choice for Trump as a VP candidate - he's awkward, uncharismatic, not funny, and also extremely hostile. For example, after the Trump assassination attempt, he quickly blamed Biden for the incident.










So why was JD picked? My bet is on money. Vance's connections to Silicon Valley investors like Peter Thiel, Elon Musk, Ben Horowicz, Marc Andreessen and David Sacks bring in huge campaign contributions to Trump who at times has been strapped for cash.

The group, America PAC, is funded by several wealthy tech entrepreneurs in Mr. Musk's social circle and is said to be likely to draw financial support from the SpaceX and Tesla founder himself.

Co-founders of Silicon Valley venture capital firm back Trump's presidential bid

Ben Horowitz and Marc Andreessen, founders of A16Z, plan to give large donations to former president's campaign

The co-founders of Silicon Valley's most prominent venture capital firm have announced their support for Donald Trump's bid for re-election, and plan to make substantial donations to back him further.

Ben Horowitz and Marc Andreessen, the heads of Andreessen Horowitz, commonly known as A16Z, revealed their plans in a sprawling 90-minute podcast, in which they argued that the future of "American innovation" required a Trump victory.

In return, Vance has allegedly promised to deregulate crypto and remove safeguards around AI development. And as an investor, having your favorite candidate in the White House can't be bad for business, eh?


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
Thiel is betting - again - on the same phenomenon in America. Betting that he will be first among a new breed of tech bro oligarchs - a new super-class of broligarchs.


In Trump's America, there will be hard choices for everyone, including the billionaires. Though it may be less hard for them. Vance has said he wants to deregulate crypto and unshackle AI. He's said he'd dismantle Biden's attempts to place safeguards around AI development.

And while he has it in for the legacy monopolies of Google and Facebook - the platforms that his ideological bedfellows in the "new right" see as part of the "censorship industrial complex" suffocating rightwing speech - Silicon Valley is betting on a gloves-off, regulation-free, pro-business goldrush.

Like his investor buddies, JD is also extremely opportunistic. In 2016, he was strongly against Trump's presidency, calling him "divisive and arrogant" and "America's Hitler", referring to himself as a "never Trump guy" and calling Trump's voters "idiots".









But apparently his wealthy overlords changed their minds about Trump: in 2021, after announcing his senate candidacy, JD had been politically cuckolded by Trump. This led to JD deleting some of his old social media posts and publicly apologizing for his past behavior.






J.D. Vance Is the Latest Prominent Conservative Calling on Journalists to Be Investigated

Sen. J.D. Vance (R-Ohio) <u>told</u> CNN's Jake Tapper on Sunday that he'd like to see journalists investigated for possibly colluding against Donald Trump in 2020. Vance's appearance on Tapper's Sunday talk show followed a letter Vance sent last week to Attorney General Merrick Garland demanding to know if the Department of Justice would investigate a *Washington Post* columnist for talking about "open rebellion" by blue states if Trump is elected in 2024.

JD's stance on the Russo-Ukrainian War has been in line with the tech bros that support him. In Apr 2022, he stated that "I don't really care what happens to Ukraine one way or the other".

JD hasn't also been shy about sharing literal Russian disinformation, when he...



... claimed that the US is sending money to Ukraine "so that one of Zelenskyy's ministers can buy a bigger yacht". The fake story about Zelenskyy (not his ministers) buying a yacht was spread by supervatnik and conman John Mark Dougan:

He's also published a Senate memo claiming that Ukraine isn't accounting for the aid they're given (Ukraine established a parliamentary commission for this sole purpose in 2022) & that Ukraine has too few soldiers - the latter may be true at this point, but they now have...


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
Report highlights:

1. The Ukrainian Armed Forces (UAF) and U.S. personnel failed to keep track of key defense articles, severely limiting the ability to determine whether these were misused or stolen. The report found that the UAF "did not provide expenditure reports by serial number" to U.S. personnel—reports that enable the U.S. to track which weapons have been lost or destroyed in battle. Worse, the UAF also failed to inventory durable U.S.-supplied defense articles designated for EEUM. This includes valuable equipment that can be reused to fire weapons and that, the report notes, "should still be currently active in Ukraine." UAF personnel had not inventoried any of the 68 Stinger gripstocks


... 14 fresh and trained brigades waiting to rotate to the frontlines, but the troops are not properly armed due to delays in Western aid. And as most of you know, these life-costing delays were mostly due to political decisions made by JD's MAGA gang & speaker Mike Johnson.

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
