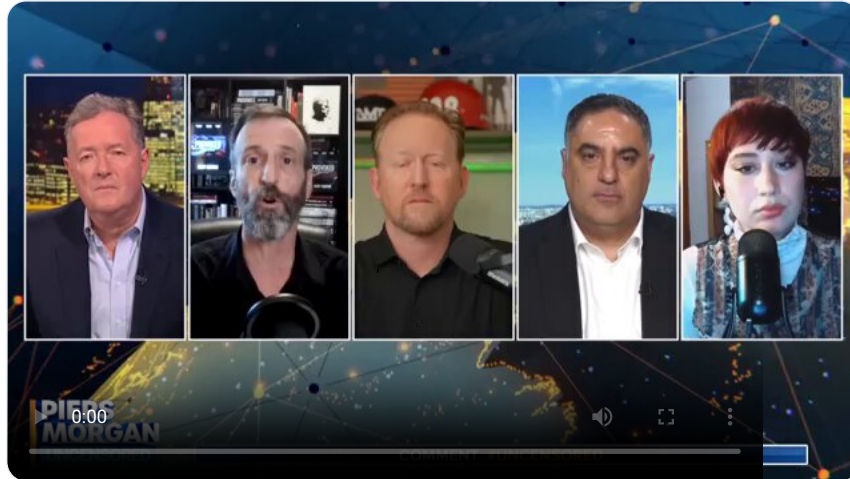

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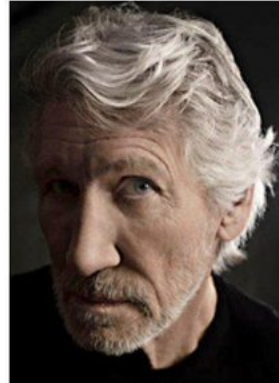

John Mearsheimer is the Wendell Harrison Distinguished Service Professor of Political Science at the University of Chicago and one of the leading foreign policy scholars in America. Here's what he has to say to you.

Dear Antiwar.com Reader,

One would think that in a venerable liberal democracy like the United States, there would be open and free-wheeling debate in the mainstream media about the key foreign policy issues of the day. One would certainly think that would be the case given the recent debacles in Afghanistan and Iraq, not to mention the unfolding debacle in Ukraine.



But sadly, that is not the case. There is a deeply entrenched and constricted narrative about American foreign policy that dominates the commanding heights in both the Democratic and Republican parties and is also found in virtually every corner of the mainstream media. Moreover, the White House and the deep state have become adept at shaping that narrative, in good part by making it difficult for opponents to challenge it. There is little reason to think this situation will change anytime soon.

This means that we need alternative media more than ever. We need a variety of first-rate outlets that invite dissent and help foster a vibrant marketplace of ideas. The reason is simple. All countries sometimes pursue foolish if not reckless policies, as the United States has demonstrated in recent years. One of the best ways to avoid disastrous policies is to have serious public debates where dissenters have free rein to speak truth to power. After all, isn't this the core reason why freedom of speech and freedom of the press are enshrined in the constitution?

Since opposition to war is at the heart of our philosophy, and single-issue politics is the only avenue open to us, Antiwar.com embodies the politics of the possible.

Our dedication to libertarian principles, inspired in large part by the works and example of the late **Murray N. Rothbard**, is reflected on this site. While openly acknowledging that we have an agenda, the editors take seriously our purely journalistic mission, which is to get past the media filters and reveal the truth about America's foreign policy.
