'Kremlin's agents in robes' – or the role of Russian Church in the Ukraine war

Russia claims to be the last bastion of Christian tradition, but its history tells a different story. For decades, it has persecuted religious groups, tortured, imprisoned and murdered clergymen, bombed churches, and used the Orthodox Church as a state tool.

Despite claiming to be a Christian nation, Russia has repressed Christianity when it doesn't serve the state. Under the USSR – and especially under Stalin – churches were demolished, priests executed, and believers sent to the Gulag. Today, this same persecution continues.

For example, the Russian Orthodox Church (ROC) isn't in any way independent – it's a Kremlin propaganda tool. Its leader, Patriarch Kirill, acts more like a government spokesperson, blessing war crimes, encouraging young men to fight & spreading state narratives worldwide.





The Orthodox Church is also a weapon for controlling religious groups, and priests who speak out against the war or the government are harassed or excommunicated. For example, Archpriest Andrei Kordochkin was suspended from service for his pacifist positions.





The Kremlin is aggressively persecuting non-Orthodox organizations. The Jehovah's Witnesses have been banned since 2017 and its members are often arrested & imprisoned. Protestant communities are also harassed, with their churches raided by the FSB under bogus accusations.

Relentless Religious Persecution in Russia

Last June, a Russian court sentenced Jehovah's Witness, Andrew Stupnikov, to six years in prison. He previously spent nearly eight months in detention and four months under house arrest. The same day of Stupnikov's sentencing, another Russian court sentenced four other Jehovah's Witnesses to 3-5 years in prison. These cases have been prosecuted under counter-terrorism laws.

What could the Jehovah's Witnesses, a tiny religious community in Russia, have done to earn such ire from Moscow? Why is it that the Russian government has formally labeled each of these individuals as "extremists" and therefore a threat to the state? Russia has designated the Jehovah's Witnesses as an extremist cult and therefore a menace to Russian families and the Russian state. This is a bad omen for all religious minorities in Russia.





Since annexing Crimea in 2014, Russia has targeted Crimean Tatars, a Muslim community. Mosques and schools have been shut down, leaders imprisoned, and people disappeared – labeled "terrorists" just for practicing their faith.

Crimean Tatars also face routine police raids, surveillance, and forced conscription into the Russian army. Their cultural and religious identity is under constant attack. And this is nothing new – Tatars were targeted and forcefully deported already during the 40s.






Even smaller Christian sects, like Baptists and Evangelicals, face discrimination. The Kremlin often labels them as "Western agents," and their worship services are disrupted, and their pastors are given fines and threatened with violence and/or imprisonment.

Russian antisemitism runs DEEP. The "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," a fabricated antisemitic text, was promoted by the Russian Empire and later weaponized by the Soviets. Today, state media still regularly peddles antisemitic conspiracies.



Putin's regime claims to be "anti-Nazi," yet its propaganda is riddled with Nazi-style antisemitic tropes. From blaming Jews for revolutions to pushing conspiracies like the Great Reset, Russia continues its long tradition of state-sponsored hate.

Sergei Lavrov made the comments to try to justify Russia's portrayal of Ukraine as "Nazi" despite the fact that its president is Jewish.

The Russian Orthodox Church has long been tied to espionage. During Soviet times, priests acted as KGB informants and many of them were even KGB-trained agents (like Kirill). Today, the church is still just an ideological weapon for the Kremlin.



The Kremlin uses the church to push nationalist propaganda. It promotes the war, and its priests are recruiting soldiers to the meat grinder, even enabling war crimes by claiming that "Russian war dead have their sins forgiven."

In Ukraine, Russia has bombed over 600 churches and religious buildings. Even the historic Sviatohirsk Lavra monastery was shelled back in 2022, killing monks and civilians. In other words, Russia is actively trying to erase Ukraine's Orthodox cultural heritage.

Russia continues to torture priests and destroy Ukrainian churches – IRF released new report in English and in Ukrainian


Russian troops killed about 50 Ukrainian priests and destroyed 700 Ukrainian

This was stated by the President of Ukraine Volodymyr Zelensky in an interview with the SBN TV channel.

According to Zelensky, priests were killed for refusing to serve Russian Patriarch Kirill and the Russian Church - they were shot, and some were tortured. Priests were also taken prisoner.

In the occupied regions, Russia is seizing churches and transferring them to the Moscow Patriarchate, and priests loyal to Moscow replace local clergy. There are several cases where these priests have worked for the FSB, and have spied on behalf of the Russian state.



Russia's religious persecution in Ukraine against various religious groups that do not align with the Kremlin's political agenda is staggering. Dozens of brutal persecution cases - including torture, illegal deportations, disappearances - of Orthodox Christians, Muslims, Protestants, Catholics, and Jehovah's Witnesses have been documented since February 2022. Russia has been spreading misinformation and reversing the blame on Ukraine in order to continue exercising these abhorrent acts of human rights abuse and to use them to advance the Kremlin's political agenda.

As the Russian president signed a bill to annex Crimea Tuesday, the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in the peninsula has been experiencing what a Church official calls "total persecution."

"At this moment all Ukrainian Greek Catholic life in Crimea is paralyzed," Fr. Volodymyr Zhdan, chancellor of the Stryi eparchy in western Ukraine, told CNA March 18.


In the last two years, Russo-American propaganda, led by @tuckercarlson and @robertamsterdam, has accused Zelenskyy of "persecuting Christians" in Ukraine by banning the Moscow Patriachy in the country. Read more about this propaganda push here:



And in reality, the country Putin claims to be "saving" from the "godless West" is actually more religious than Russia. Ukrainians have higher church attendance and stronger faithbased values. Meanwhile, Russia suppresses real religious freedom.

When only 14% of your citizens go to church on a regular basis, 73 out of 100 marriages end in divorce, you've got 500 000 abandoned children, you're the European leader of children raised by single parents and abortions per capita, but you still managed to convince the leaders of the European alt-right that you're the true bastion of conservative values because of anti-LGBT laws and high levels of domestic violence.





Russia is one of the least religious countries in the world. Church attendance is low, and many Russians identify as Orthodox in name only, without actively practicing their faith. The state promotes Orthodoxy as a cultural tool, not a true religious revival.



Despite Kremlin rhetoric about "traditional values," polls show that only a small fraction of Russians regularly attend church. For many, Orthodoxy is more of a national identity than a deeply held faith. In other words, it's just a "Potemkin Faith".

Another criterion to count religious populations in Russia is that of "religious observance". Based on this principle, very few Russians would be religious. It has been found that between 0.5% and 2% of people in big cities attend Easter services, and overall just between 2% and 10% of the total population (3 to 15 million people) are actively practising Orthodox Christians. The proportion of practising Muslims among ethnic groups which are historically Islamic is larger, 40% to 90% depending on the group, and yet smaller than any assumption based on the ethnic principle. Ukraine, instead,is actually a Christian, conservative country. If it weren't for the billions spent in Kremlin propaganda, any serious right-wing conservative would be siding with Ukraine, not Russia. But the MAGA "Christ is King" gang are not very good Christians, either.

DEGREE OF RELIGIOSITY, TRUST IN THE CHURCH


Although with the beginning of Russia's full-scale aggression, the share of citizens who call themselves believers rose from 68% at the end of 2021 to 74% in November 2022, in 2023-2024 it decreased (to 70.5% in 2023 and 68% in 2024 — from 85% of residents in the West of the country to 55% in the East).


The country's West is traditionally characterized by a higher level of religiosity (85% here called themselves believers), the East — lower (55%). However, compared to 2000, the share of those who consider themselves believers in the Central, Southern and Eastern regions has increased, while in the Western region it has not changed. Hence, the difference between the regions in the share of believers is decreasing.

Traditionally, the level of religiosity is higher in older age groups, compared to younger ones (in 2024, the share of believers was the lowest among 18–24 year-olds — 52%, in other age groups — from 61% to 76%).

There are more believers among women compared to men (76% and 58%, respectively). The share of believers is higher among villagers (76.5%) than among citizens (63.5%).

The Church is trusted by the majority of Ukrainian citizens. However, compared to 2010, when the level of public trust in the Church was record high (72.5%), now, it is lower -62.5%. The residents of the Western regions trust the Church the most (78%) of respondents). In the Southern regions, 62% trust it, in the Central regions -61%, and the lowest level of trust in the Church is recorded in the Eastern regions, where only a relative majority of respondents (47%) expressed trust in it, which is only 8% higher than the share of those who do not trust it.
