




Another theory is that Putin holds kompromat — compromising material such as videos or documents — that would put Trump in an extremely bad light. Some have suggested it could be tied to the Epstein files or Russia's interference in the 2016 US presidential election.





Former KGB chief of Kazakhstan Alnur Mussayev even claimed that Trump was recruited by the Soviet Union in 1987 under the codename "Krasnov." No solid evidence has ever surfaced, but Trump's actions do look odd given Russia's relatively limited global influence and power.



The setup for the Alaska Summit was disastrous from the start. Trump's favorite real estate agent, Steven Witkoff, went to Moscow with no expertise and not even a proper translator, only to get played again by Kremlin spies who shifted their demands right after the meeting.



Even the location of the Summit favored Russia, as the state was once part of Russia, sold to the US by a previous Tsar. Russians have been pushing the idea that Alaska should return under Moscow's rule: welcoming Putin there handed the Kremlin yet another symbolic victory.

Russian propaganda has come up with the false narrative that Alaska was not sold but leased for 99 years, although there is no evidence to back this up. According to the myth, the Soviet Union decided not to take the peninsula back in 1966.

Another myth circulated in Russia is that the country never received the gold for Alaska, as it allegedly sank in a sea storm while being transported by ship.












... as Trump refused to take a single question. The whole fiasco made the US look weak, and even Fox News, Trump's favorite media outlet, admitted that Putin came to Alaska and "steamrolled" him. After the Summit, Trump went golfing and left Rubio to spin the fiasco.



Rubio claimed there would be no sanctions on Russia, arguing they'd "interfere" with peace talks and that Putin would just keep the war going if punished. Rubio refused to name any concessions Russia should make, claiming it would "collapse the negotiations."



Less than 24 hours later, Trump himself named two, but for Ukraine: no NATO membership, and surrendering Crimea, as he's been hinting at for two years.

Art of the Deal, or something.

But as always with Trump, one must look at his actions rather than at his words.



Fox News cut out comments by former President Donald Trump in which he said he would have considered letting Russia have parts of Ukraine as part of a peace deal between the nations.

In an interview on Fox News host Sean Hannity's radio show on Monday, which is not broadcast by Fox, Trump revealed how he would try and broker a peace deal between Russia and Ukraine in the wake of Russia's invasion last year.

Trump has claimed he can quickly bring an end to the war as he seeks election again in 2024.

- Zelensky in Washington: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has arrived in Washington, DC, where he will be joined by key European leaders when he meets with Donald Trump this afternoon. Trump says Zelensky must agree to some of Russia's conditions including that Ukraine cede Crimea and agree never to join NATO for the war to end.
- Potential security guarantees: At last week's summit with Trump, President Vladimir Putin agreed to allow security guarantees for Ukraine and made concessions on "land swaps" as part of a potential peace deal, US envoy Steve Witkoff told CNN. Zelensky suggested that such guarantees would need to be stronger than those that "didn't work" in the past. Russia has yet to mention such agreements.
- Change in tactics: Trump is now focused on securing a peace deal without pursuing a ceasefire due to his progress with Putin, Witkoff said. In seeking this deal, Trump has backed away from his threat of new sanctions on Moscow, despite calls to impose more economic pressure.

So far, he's:

- Disbanded US sanctions enforcement
- Cut tracking of kidnapped children
- Blocked aid approved by Congress
- Opposed oil price cap at G7
- Paused intelligence sharing to Ukraine
- Made the US and allies vote against a UN resolution condemning the aggression

Trump to abandon Russia war crimes prosecution

Washington signals end to pursuit of Putin as third anniversary of Ukraine invasion looms

The US has signalled that it could leave an international effort to prosecute Russia for invading Ukraine, The Telegraph can reveal.

US envoys refused to label Russia as an "aggressor" at a meeting of a "core group" of countries preparing a Nuremberg-style tribunal to try Vladimir Putin for his war crimes, according to Western officials.

Washington is similarly refusing to co-sponsor a United Nations statement that supports Ukraine's territorial integrity and demands Moscow to withdraw its forces from the war-torn nation.

Mr Trump's administration has also refused to sign off a planned G7 statement calling Russia the "aggressor" in the war with Ukraine to mark the third anniversary of the conflict on Monday.

The US president has blamed Ukraine for starting the war, branded Volodymyr Zelensky a "dictator" and pushed for Russia to be invited back to the alliance of industrialised nations.

European officials fear Mr Trump's flattery of Putin could lead to the Russian despot being let off the hook for his invasion as part of any peace settlement.

Donald Trump has said <u>Vladimir Putin</u> was "doing what anybody would do" after Russia launched a massive missile and drone strike on Ukraine days after the US cut off vital intelligence and military aid to Kyiv.

Ironically, the US in general has conversely shown strong support for Ukraine: 83 (out of 100) Senators backed a secondary sanctions bill targeting Russia's energy sector, demonstrating rare bipartisan unity outside of Trump's MAGA, and polls show support for Ukraine.







% who have ___ confidence in Russian President Vladimir Putin to do the right thing regarding world affairs





Trump has even challenged NATO's Article 5, the cornerstone of the alliance. He's said he would let Russia "do whatever the hell they want" to allies who don't spend enough on defense — an open invitation for Putin to test the West's unity.






