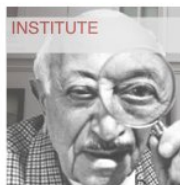

War on Women's Bodies. Sexual Violence during the Holocaust in Ukraine




Sexual violence was one of the most horrific parts of women's everyday lives during the Holocaust. This research project analyses the causes, patterns, dynamics, and consequences of sexual violence against Jewish women and girls during the Shoah in Ukraine using a gender approach. The main questions under consideration include: Was sexual violence a by-product or rather a tool of genocide? How and why could rape be considered an instrument of terror, humiliation, punishment, revenge, dehumanisation, demonstrating power, bonding among perpetrators, and constructing gender roles? What is sexual about sexual violence in the Holocaust? The project analyses how cultural ideas and discourses about the body, sexuality, reproduction, and ethnic, racial, national, religious, and political identity as well as positions of power contributed to perpetrators' motivations and strategies for sexual violence, as well as victims'/survivors' experiences of these processes. The project seeks to create a meaningful space for Jewish women's voices and perspectives.


Marta Havryshko is a Research Associate at the I. Krypiakevych Institute of Ukrainian Studies at the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine. Her research interests include sexual violence during the Holocaust and the Second World War, gender history, and nationalism. In 2019/20, she was a fellow at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. Her research has been supported by Yad Vashem, the German Academic Exchange Service, Yahad-In Unum, Monash University, and others.

But her academic background plays little role in her public profile. Marta gained Grokipedia (not Wikipedia) fame by sharing videos of alleged far-right activity and forced mobilization in Ukraine. She claims the country is a Nazi state, including its government.

The Far Right's Influence on Post-Maidan Ukraine

Do you think that far-right groups took advantage of the opportunity during the events on the Maidan and imposed their ideology on Ukrainian society?

Yes, I am convinced that Maidan allowed ultra-nationalists to seize memory politics in Ukraine. They began to push an ultra-nationalist narrative. From the beginning, many people were not in favour of this narrative. Many opposed it. They did not want monuments and streets of Bandera and **Shukhevyh** in their cities.

These contradictions over the Soviet legacy deepened further after the 2023 launch of "de-colonisation", essentially removing all traces of the Russian heritage present in Ukraine. By destroying this memory, Ukraine liquidated an important part of its own history, becoming less diverse, inclusive and more ethno-nationalist and myth-centric.

Now, a clear distinction is needed between activism and academic work. Havryshko is not an expert on far-right or neo-Nazi groups and has no scientific publications on the topic. She should therefore be described as a heavily biased, anti-Ukraine online activist.

Ms. Havryshko eagerly highlights even minor social media posts showing alleged far-right activity in Ukraine, yet shows little interest when the same occurs in the US. In her upside-down framing, American neo-Nazis are protected by the First Amendment, so it's all kosher.

Some of my not very smart haters have been enthusiastically twisting the comment below into "proof" that I supposedly instrumentalize the fight against neo-Nazis in Ukraine while conveniently "ignoring" neo-Nazis elsewhere — including the United States.

So let me spell it out. Slowly. Again.

What I meant is simple: in the U.S., a disturbing amount of what most people would plainly recognize as hate speech is legally protected as free speech under the First Amendment.

That's why in America you can literally watch groups like Aryan Nations, RAM, Atomwaffen Division, Patriot Front, or the Oath Keepers parade down the streets with Nazi-style symbolism, slogans, and aesthetics — not hidden in the shadows, but out in public, often acting as if they're just another "opinion" in the marketplace of ideas.

And yes, their defenders routinely fall back on one well-known precedent: the Skokie Affair (1977), when U.S. courts upheld the First Amendment rights of Nazis to march through a predominantly Jewish suburb populated by Holocaust survivors — with a swastika.

Now compare that to Ukraine.

In Ukraine, there are the so-called decommunization laws of 2015 and provisions of the Criminal Code of Ukraine (Article 436-1), which explicitly prohibit the propaganda of the National Socialist regime and the distribution of its symbols.

Is that clear now — or do we need to go through it one more time?

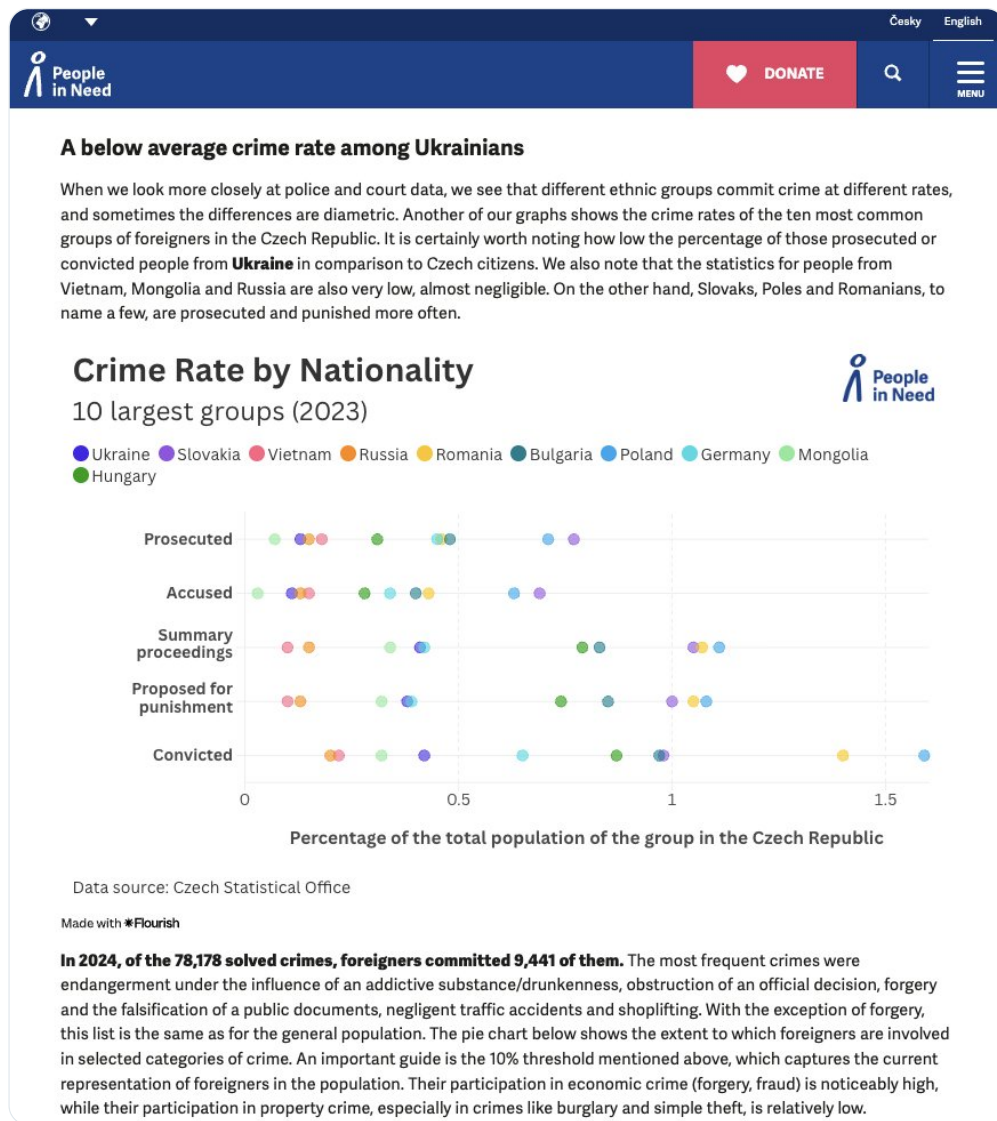

This likely explains why she has become a regular guest on Norwegian vatnik Glenn Diesen’s show. Diesen is a member of Putin’s Valdai club, has worked extensively for RT, denied Russia’s role in the MH17 shootdown, and labeled the Euromaidan as a “NATO-backed coup d’État.”



And if chatting shit with Diesen wasn't bad enough, it gets worse. Much worse. In December 2025, Marta appeared on Jackson Hinkle's Legitimate Targets propaganda show. As a Ukrainian activist, she did not seem bothered by Hinkle's open support for the Putin regime.

German election: AfD's Weidel doubles down on Holocaust comments

BERLIN — The leader of the far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party, Alice Weidel, ignited a fresh wave of controversy following remarks during a Sunday appearance on German public broadcaster ARD, claiming the Holocaust is used as a cudgel against her party.

“I find it quite disturbing when the Holocaust is politically instrumentalized,” Weidel said, adding that remembrance should stand above “day-to-day politics.”



For some reason, Marta failed to do even basic background research on AfD. She missed that the party's members have used Nazi paramilitary slogans like "Alles für Deutschland," and some have openly defended the Waffen SS. And here we thought she was against neo-Nazism.

Left-wing newspaper *Libération* has [revealed](#) that Marine Le Pen's Rassemblement National (RN) will not sit alongside the Alternative für Deutschland (AfD) in the European Parliament after the European elections on June 9th. They cite statements by the German national conservative party aimed at rehabilitating members of the SS during the Second World War.

If Havryshko sees no issue associating with figures like Jackson Hinkle, who praised Putin from the start of the full-scale invasion, or with parties like AfD, which is openly hostile to Ukraine and supportive of Russia, her sudden re-alignment towards Moscow is clear.

Russia attacks Ukraine

The entire collective West is screaming:

‘Violation of international law!’

Day four after the U.S. ‘brings democracy’ to Venezuela, kidnaps its president, kills about 80 people.

We don’t yet have the full picture.’

Judging by her recent sarcastic posts, she now openly despises Ukraine. Marta’s rapid shift from a refugee who fled Putin’s invasion and understood the need to fight him to a pro-Kremlin activist claiming Ukraine started the war raises an obvious question — what happened?

At 4:30 a.m. I saw that Vladimir Putin had started his address. Who would give an address late at night? What was it for? For what purpose? "There could be only one purpose – a great war against Ukraine", I thought. From the very beginning of Putin's aggressive speech, I could not contain my emotions. I cried not only for my unrealized academic plans and projects. I was crying because, as a researcher of war and the Holocaust, I know the price of war, I understand the suffering it brings to innocent people, the dramatic and lasting consequences it has, and how it makes ordinary people commit extraordinary evil.

Black thoughts swarmed in my head. I remembered dozens of stories of women from the Second World War that I had heard directly from them, or read in interviews with them or in their diaries and memoirs. I remembered the story of Regina Brudinger, a young Jewish girl whose studies at a teacher training school in Lviv had been interrupted by German bombs in the early morning of June 22, 1941. I admired her courage and bravery, because by the dawn she had volunteered at a military hospital and had been working as a nurse throughout the war. I also remembered another woman, Kazymyra Poray, who had saved her husband and mother-in-law in the first days of the war and during the Lviv pogrom of 1941. She tried to get food for them and protect them from the angry mob that craved the blood of their Jewish neighbors.

I thought about other women and their relatives who, in the first days of the German attack on the Soviet Union, tried to comprehend what was happening, guess the future, and make decisions that became fateful. "Should we flee or stay?", many of them thought. "If we flee, where can we go and with whom?" These were the questions that loomed over me in the first days of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Fear for my 9-year-old son, Danylo, forced my imagination to draw macabre pictures of his possible sufferings in the war, much like the ones experienced by children in Ukraine during the Nazi occupation. I wanted to protect my son from the horrors of war, and in early March I decided to leave my home and my family.

What is Russia doing?

The Kremlin, on the other hand, is trying to portray Ukraine as the new Nazis and Russians as the new Jews. Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, for example, claimed that Adolf Hitler had Jewish roots to explain how Ukraine could be a Nazi state, even though President Volodymyr Zelensky is Jewish. Israel was outraged. But the Kremlin twists history into a myth to justify its actions and mobilize the population. Completely ignored is the fact that Ukrainians also served in the Red Army and fought against the Nazis. This doesn't fit the narrative of good versus evil. There were Nazi collaborators in both Russia and Ukraine during World War II, but in Russia, this is a taboo subject.

And recently?

After the Maidan Revolution in 2014, Russia annexed Crimea and supported the separatists in the Donbas. And on February 24, 2022, the invasion followed. Try to put yourself in the shoes of the Ukrainian people. I fear that many people in countries as safe as Switzerland are unable to do so. Every attempt to forge a Ukrainian national identity has been crushed by Moscow. The invasion is just the latest chapter in a history marked by oppression and suffering. Confront it instead of being bothered by the fact that the news is clouding your daily life. You want peace? So do I. But not at the cost of a Russian occupation of my homeland, to which I cannot return. And the Third Reich wasn't stopped by waving peace flags, but by tanks. Anyone who turns a blind eye to what Russia is doing in Ukraine becomes complicit in these crimes.

Marta often encourages pro-Ukraine activists to “go to the front.” One of them did, and later urged her to raise funds for Ukrainian children or civilians. Instead, he was accused of “stalking,” and as far as we know Ms Havryshko has raised a grand total of 0€ for Ukraine.

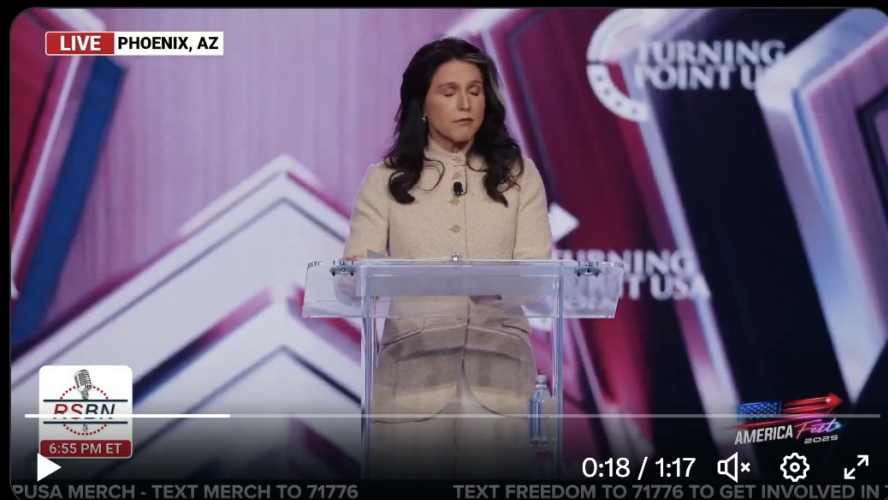

There are voices in the West, including in Switzerland, that blame Ukraine, the West, NATO, and the USA for the war. What is your view on this?

This is a classic case of victim-blaming. In a rape case, the blame never lies with the victim, but always with the perpetrator – regardless of how short his skirt was. We mustn't fall into this trap when discussing politics. Ultimately, it is Russian bombs that are killing the Ukrainian population in their homes. The West's responsibility lies primarily in its policy of appeasement towards Russia. And one certainly cannot say that the aggression came without warning. Think of Chechnya, Georgia, and Syria. In Ukraine, we have been living with Russian, imperialistically motivated repression, threats, and troop build-ups for decades. The Soviet Union brutally conquered Ukraine in 1922. Millions died in the great famine of 1932-1933. The country was Russified over decades. In 1991, Ukraine declared its independence, but this did nothing to change Russia's claims. Can you imagine having such a superior giant as a neighbor?

Russian propaganda portrays Ukraine as a country controlled by Nazis. What is your view on this, especially as a historian?

The Kremlin propagated the idea of Nazis and fascists in Ukraine long before February 24, 2022. Even the Maidan Revolution was discredited as a rebellion by far-right groups. But far-right extremists, unfortunately, exist in every country. In reality, the revolution had broad popular support. It was a turning point in Ukrainian history. We distanced ourselves from Russian influence and embraced European values. But we always knew that Russia would never let us go—like someone who commits domestic violence. The problem lies in the imperialist attitude toward Ukraine, which is widespread in Russia.
