The treaty, signed in Kiev on January 28, 2003, is a framework document determining the state border between the two countries on land, including rivers and lakes, and the fundamental approach to the issues connected with the Black and Azov seas and the Kerch Strait.

The line of the state border has been mapped as a result of the joint work on the demarcation of the border carried out by the Russian and Ukrainian demarcation commissions.

The basis of the border is the administrative boundary between the RSFSR and the Ukrainian SSR at the time of the dissolution of the USSR, which is to be sealed by corresponding state legal documents.

The description of the passage of the state border and the atlas of the maps of the state border between the Russian Federation and Ukraine have been made and agreed upon, and form an inalienable part of the treaty.

The U.S.-led campaign to denuclearize Ukraine began in 1992. Having strained under the yoke of foreign powers for centuries, Kyiv jealously guarded its nascent independence. Many Russians viewed their neighbor's sovereignty as anomalous, and Ukraine's postcommunist leadership feared what they might do about it. Mr. Kravchuk had been born in 1934 under one foreign government, Poland; saw his father die fighting a second, Germany; and lived decades under communist rule. He was determined not to see his nation subjugated again. The inherited Soviet arsenal represented a potent check against future Russian aggression.

Kravchuk's government therefore harbored apprehensions about abandoning it. He considered trading this ace for an ironclad territorial guarantee, something akin to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's Article 5 umbrella. But Secretary of State James Baker balked. He believed this would result in identical demands from all post-Soviet states. When Ukraine subsequently resisted committing to disarmament through the 1992 Lisbon Protocol, Mr. Baker put this defiance to an end with a blistering phone call. "I have never heard one man speak to another in quite that way," Jim Timbie, an aide who was with Mr. Baker at the time, said in describing the secretary's side of the conversation to Ambassador Thomas Graham Jr. Mr. Baker required that the signing ceremony the next day adjourn without speeches from the parties.

Following U.S. elections that November, Mr. Kravchuk gained an untested negotiating partner but not new leverage. Bill Clinton's administration proved even less amenable to his concerns. As archival documents show, a new cadre of officials approached the issue with a heightened sense of certainty—and urgency. "Ukraine could not keep nuclear weapons," Steven Pifer, a State Department official who later served as ambassador to Ukraine (1998-2000), recalled in 2018. "No one in the U.S. government questioned" this objective. A sign in the Office of New Independent States fashioned a Clintonian mantra to match the prevailing view: "It's the nukes, stupid."

The full-court press began on the president's sixth day in office. Teleconference transcripts reveal Mr. Clinton neither waited for the full-scale review of disarmament policy the General Accounting Office recommended in 1993 nor for Ambassador Strobe Talbott's comprehensive appraisal of existing policies toward post-Soviet states before dialing up the pressure on Kyiv. On his first call with Mr. Kravchuk in office, on Jan. 26, 1993, Mr. Clinton offered \$175 million—which grew to \$700 million by 1994—in exchange for dismantlement of Ukraine's nuclear arsenal. He also proposed "strong security assurances" from the U.S. to assuage Mr. Kravchuk's security fears.

The final nuclear warheads were handed over to Russia by July 1996. The US paid Ukraine around half a billion dollars to aid the effort.

After the Soviet collapse, Ukraine also inherited approximately 102 strategic bombers: 23 Tu-95MS, 19 Tu-160, and more than 60 Tu-22M3. But when it agreed to give up nuclear weapons, it also agreed to scrap or dismantle the majority of these bombers.

The rest of the bombers were eventually turned over to Russia because Ukraine faced challenges in maintaining and operating these strategic bombers due to economic constraints, a lack of spare parts, and geopolitical pressures.

After a stopover in London, the senators returned to Washington and declared that the U.S. should devote funds to speed up the destruction of more than 400,000 small arms, 1,000 anti-aircraft missiles, and more than 15,000 tons of ammunition.

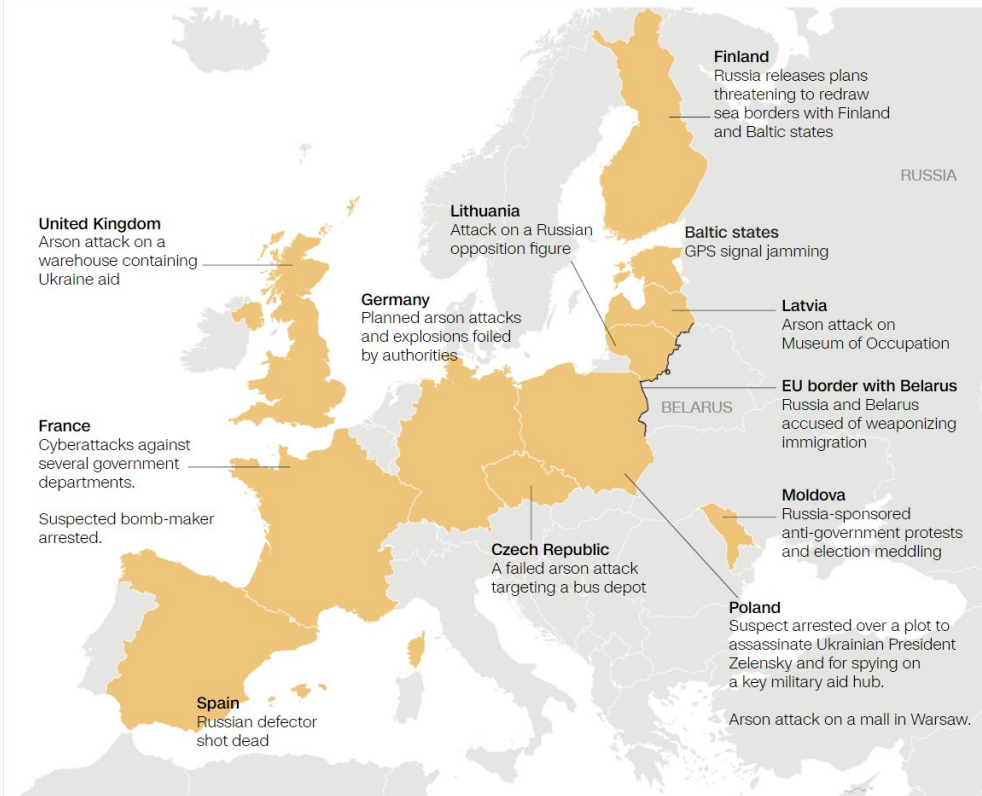

ICC refers Hungary to oversight body for not arresting Netanyahu during state visit

THE HAGUE, Netherlands — A panel of judges at the International Criminal Court has reported Hungary to the court's oversight organization for failing to arrest Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu when he visited Budapest in April, stating that the move undercut the court's ability to bring suspects to justice.

The Israeli leader received a red carpet welcome from Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban during a state visit, in defiance of an ICC arrest warrant. Netanyahu and former defense minister Yoav Gallant are accused of crimes against humanity in connection with the war in Gaza.

Ukraine situation: ICC Pre-Trial Chamber II finds that Mongolia failed to cooperate in the arrest and surrender of Vladimir Vladimirovich Putin and refers the matter to the Assembly of States Parties



Today, 24 October 2024, Pre-Trial Chamber II of the International Criminal Court (“ICC” or “the Court”) found that, by failing to arrest Mr Putin while he was on its territory and surrender him to the Court, Mongolia has failed to comply with the Court’s request to cooperate in this regard contrary to the provisions of the Rome Statute (“Statute”), thereby preventing the Court from exercising its functions and powers within the meaning of article 87(7) of the Statute. In view of the seriousness of Mongolia’s failure to cooperate with the Court, the Chamber deemed it necessary to refer the matter to the Assembly of States Parties.

The Chamber reaffirmed that personal immunity, including that of Heads of State, is not opposable before the ICC, and no waiver is required. States Parties and those accepting the Court’s jurisdiction are duty-bound to arrest and surrender individuals subject to ICC warrants, regardless of official position or nationality. The Chamber highlighted that the ICC operates independently of State involvement, addressing serious international crimes. Under Article 86 of the Rome Statute, all States Parties must fully cooperate with the Court to support its mandate. The Chamber further recalled that the Court performs functions that align with the general interests of the international community by exercising jurisdiction over the most serious international crimes, which include grave breaches of fundamental norms of international law.

Situation in Ukraine: ICC judges issue arrest warrants against Vladimir Vladimirovich Putin and Maria Alekseyevna Lvova-Belova



Today, 17 March 2023, Pre-Trial Chamber II of the International Criminal Court ("ICC" or "the Court") issued warrants of arrest for two individuals in the context of the situation in Ukraine: Mr Vladimir Vladimirovich Putin and Ms Maria Alekseyevna Lvova-Belova.

Mr Vladimir Vladimirovich Putin, born on 7 October 1952, President of the Russian Federation, is allegedly responsible for the war crime of unlawful deportation of population (children) and that of unlawful transfer of population (children) from occupied areas of Ukraine to the Russian Federation (under articles 8(2)(a)(vii) and 8(2)(b)(viii) of the Rome Statute). The crimes were allegedly committed in Ukrainian occupied territory at least from 24 February 2022. There are reasonable grounds to believe that Mr Putin bears individual criminal responsibility for the aforementioned crimes, (i) for having committed the acts directly, jointly with others and/or through others (article 25(3)(a) of the Rome Statute), and (ii) for his failure to exercise control properly over civilian and military subordinates who committed the acts, or allowed for their commission, and who were under his effective authority and control, pursuant to superior responsibility (article 28(b) of the Rome Statute).

Definition

Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide

Article II

*In the present Convention, genocide means **any** of the following acts committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a national, ethnical, racial or religious group, as such:*

1. Killing members of the group;
2. Causing serious bodily or mental harm to members of the group;
3. Deliberately inflicting on the group conditions of life calculated to bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part;
4. Imposing measures intended to prevent births within the group;
5. **Forcibly transferring children of the group to another group.**

Hungary's PM Orbán slams EU and pledges crackdown on foreign influence

"There is always an empire that is trying to take away the freedom of the Hungarians, and right now it is the one in Brussels," Viktor Orbán said in a speech on Saturday.

Hungary's prime minister on Saturday vowed to rid his country of those he claims work for the interests of foreign powers, saying his right-wing government will eliminate a global "shadow army" serving the European Union and a "liberal American empire".

In a public address, which coincided with a national holiday commemorating Hungary's 1848 revolution against Habsburg rule, Viktor Orbán told a group of several thousand supporters that Hungary in the coming weeks will uproot media outlets and other organisations that have received funding from abroad.

"After today's festive gathering comes the Easter cleaning. The bugs have overwintered," Orbán said. "We will dismantle the financial machine that has used corrupt dollars to buy politicians, judges, journalists, pseudo-NGOs and political activists. We will eliminate the entire shadow army."

Orbán, in power since 2010, has used the 15 March celebration in recent years as a podium from which to launch increasingly hostile words against the EU.

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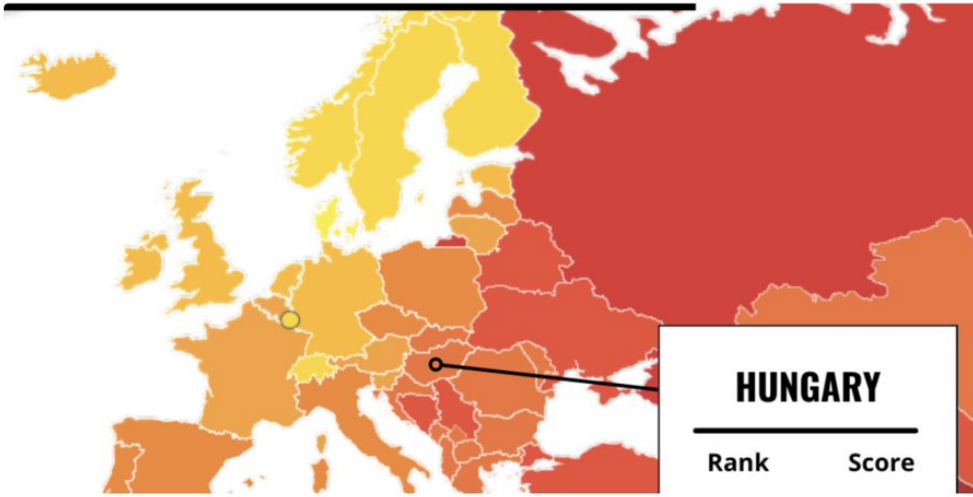

For the third year in a row, Hungary retained its ranking as the European Union's (EU) most corrupt country in the 2024 edition of the Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI), published today by the Berlin-based Secretariat of Transparency International (TI). The CPI, which is compiled every year by the international anti-corruption organisation, also shows that Hungary's ranking on an international scale of 180 countries fell by six places to the 82nd within a year. In the absence of sufficient measures to restore the rule of law and to weed out systemic corruption in Hungary, the country irrevocably lost 1.04 billion euros worth of EU cohesion policy funding in 2024, and more losses are to be expected in the coming years, according to TI Hungary's country report released in Budapest on 11 February.

Hungary now ranks last among European Union member states in a vital measure of household welfare—Actual Individual Consumption (AIC) per capita—according to **June 18, 2025 data from Eurostat**. At just 72% of the EU average, Hungary trails all 26 other countries in terms of what families actually consume, including public services like healthcare and education.

In stark contrast, Luxembourg leads the bloc with 141%, while the Netherlands and Germany stand at 120% and 118%, respectively. Even Poland, a Central European peer, comes in at a much healthier 85% of the EU average, dramatically outpacing Hungary in real living standards by about 13 percentage points.

This glaring gap grows more compelling when set against GDP per capita. Although Hungary's GDP reaches roughly 77% of the EU average, lifting it above several low-income EU nations, its households nonetheless remain poorer in consumption terms. This discrepancy highlights the fact that economic output isn't translating into real benefits for Hungarian families.

Behind the numbers lies a painful reality: under Viktor Orbán's increasingly authoritarian and pro-Russian Fidesz regime, Hungary has been systematically pillaged. State-owned industries have been hollowed out, public subsidies redirected to political allies, and EU funds commandeered by power networks close to the government. Meanwhile, ordinary Hungarians contend with low real wages, high inflation, brain drain, and a hollowed middle class—classic symptoms of wealth siphoning from citizens into elite pockets.

Adding insult to injury, a new Median poll **published June 18 by HVG** shows the opposition Tisza party—led by former Orbán insider Péter Magyar—leading Fidesz by 15 points among decided voters: 51% to 36%. Support among under-40s is even stronger, with 58% backing Tisza, while Fidesz remains stuck with older voters. Three months ago, Tisza's lead was only nine points.

The political earthquake traced by the polling data is significant not just for internal politics but geopolitically:

Hungary has long been the most vocal Kremlin ally within the EU and NATO, repeatedly vetoing Ukraine support and echoing Russian propaganda.

Now, as public support collapses, so does a key pillar of Putin's influence inside European institutions.

Fidesz's plunge in support coincides with the broader economic malaise. GDP growth has stalled, inflation remains among the EU's highest, and U.S. tariffs threaten exports—yet the government continues to trumpet superficial gains even as households feel none of the benefits.

Hungarians now consume far less than citizens of Poland—a country Orbán used to cite as a benchmark—yet boast a higher GDP. This divergence suggests that Hungary isn't just slipping behind; it is being held back by design.

Eurostat's figures, paired with HVG's poll, deliver a potent message: Orbán's model—steady macroeconomic figures coupled with authoritarian control and favoritism—has failed. Real wages are stagnant, household living standards deteriorating, and Hungarian voters are increasingly turning away from the regime.

Absent fundamental reforms—transparent allocation of EU funds, stronger rule of law, wage increases, anti-corruption enforcement—Hungary's slide looks set to continue. The poll signals not just a possible political turnover in 2026, but a decisive shift away from a pro-Russian, kleptocratic governance model.

Hungary vows safe passage for Putin for US-Russia summit

In the years since, Orbán has become an astute practitioner of the authoritarian playbook. He centralized power, changed elections laws in his favor, assembled his own clique of oligarchs, promoted white Christian nationalism, passed anti-LGBTQ legislation, curtailed freedom of the press, cracked down on dissent, and drew closer to Putin.

He also began to raise his profile in the West with the help of Fox News host Tucker Carlson. Now one of Orbán's most fervent fanboys, Carlson already had family ties to the Hungarian leader through his father, Richard Carlson, whose lobbying firm, Policy Impact Strategic Communications, is a registered lobbyist for Orbán. According to *The New York Times*, in 2019, the firm introduced Tucker to the Hungarian ambassador, set up an interview on Carlson's show that year with Hungary's minister of foreign affairs and trade, and otherwise helped Fox News orchestrate meetings and interviews with relevant Hungarian officials.

Then, last August, Carlson spent a full week broadcasting his nightly Fox News show from Budapest, replete with fawning interviews with Orbán and gushing voice-overs about how Hungary was a "small country with a lot of lessons for the rest of us."

Earlier this year, Carlson went even further, releasing a "documentary" called *Hungary vs. Soros: Fight for Civilization*, which portrays the country as a rightist utopia that has conquered illegal immigration thanks to its supposedly impenetrable border fence. Not one to shy away from antisemitism, Carlson depicts Soros as a villainous Jewish financier pulling the strings of the world leaders, directing a global conspiracy to keep borders open, and serving the interests of leftist ideologues through his support of civil society groups. "It's appalling to see Tucker Carlson and FOX invoke the kind of anti-Semitic tropes typically found in white supremacist media," tweeted Jonathan Greenblatt, CEO of the Anti-Defamation League. "There's no excuse for this kind of fear mongering, especially in light of intensifying #antisemitism."

Allies of Hungary's far-right prime minister **Viktor Orbán** will hold a closed-door meeting with Republicans in Washington to push for an end to US military support for Ukraine, the Guardian has learned.

Members of the Hungarian Institute of International Affairs and staff from the Hungarian embassy in Washington will on Monday begin a two-day event hosted by the conservative **Heritage Foundation** thinktank.

The first day includes panel speeches about the Ukraine war as well as topics such as Transatlantic Culture Wars. It is expected to feature guests including Magor Erneyi, the international director of the Centre for Fundamental Rights, the institute that organized CPAC (Conservative Political Action Conference) Hungary. **Kelley Currie**, a former ambassador under then president Donald Trump, said she was invited "but declined".

Donald Trump demanded that Ukraine submit to Vladimir Putin's peace terms or face destruction in an angry meeting at the White House last week, it has emerged.

The US president, who spoke with his Russian counterpart shortly before hosting Volodymyr Zelensky, warned that Putin would "destroy" Ukraine unless a peace deal was in place.

Trump said in Alaska he and Putin had agreed on most points. It is particularly shocking that he did not appear to push back on the most important, Putin's territorial demand, which Zelenskyy, with European support, has said is an absolute red line. Abandoning territory Ukrainians have spilled much blood over 11 years to defend is politically indefensible and militarily suicidal. It would mean relinquishing the belt of towns and fortifications as well as rivers and ridge lines that have enabled Ukraine to resist Russia's advances and help protect the rest of the country. Giving up this land would plunge Ukraine into political turmoil and leave it badly exposed to further Russian aggression.

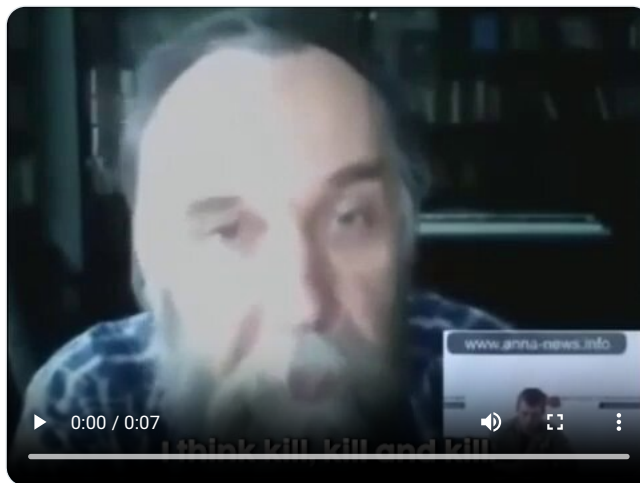

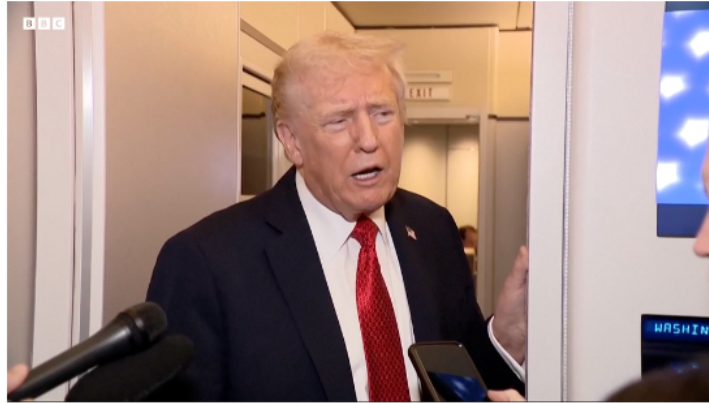

President Donald Trump's **hopes for a quick meeting** with Russian President Vladimir Putin may be stalled after sources familiar with the matter told CNN that an expected pre-meeting between the world leaders' key foreign affairs aides this week had been tabled, at least for now.

Rubio and Lavrov on Monday had a phone call and discussed “next steps” to follow up on the call between their two presidents last week about a possible end to the conflict in Ukraine, according to a brief US State Department readout of the call. Rubio “emphasized the importance of upcoming engagements as an opportunity for Moscow and Washington to collaborate on advancing a durable resolution of the Russia-Ukraine war, in line with President Trump’s vision,” according to the readout.

The Kremlin, meanwhile, described the call as a “constructive discussion” that dealt with “possible concrete steps to implement the understandings” Trump and Putin reached on the call.

A source familiar with the matter told CNN, though, that officials felt after the Rubio-Lavrov call that the Russian position has not evolved enough beyond its maximalist stance. For now, the source said, Rubio is not likely to recommend the Putin-Trump meeting move forward next week, but Rubio and Lavrov could speak again this week.
