1.6.1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF GROUP D:

- These organisations are generally regarded as well established, independent and free from Russian influence.
- ZOG, which operates in the "blue threat" environment of Moldova, has been involved in numerous incidents but has not to date one. Its fellow Moldovan organisation, Newsman, is potentially vulnerable to Kremlin influence, given its general director's connection to pro-Putin oligarch Mihail Jovanov, though despite this it has to date remained consistently critical of both the Moldovan and Russian governments.
- There are some financial transparency concerns relating to Newsman, ZOG, and IPRA, who do not disclose their funding. There are also concerns that CDDA is a vehicle for US interests and is being used to influence Polish politics in a pro-US direction.

Of course all this has been used for propaganda purposes by Russia, and these days Elon appears often on RT's headlines allegedly agreeing that the Ukrainian counterattack is failing and the 2014 Revolution of Dignity was a coup.

Meanwhile, Sacks pointed to new evidence showing that Moscow and Kiev could have come to an agreement at the very start of the conflict last year, referring to a draft treaty on neutrality and security guarantees for Ukraine shown by Russian President Vladimir Putin earlier this week.

However, the negotiations on the matter broke down in the spring 2022 after Ukraine accused Russia of committing war crimes, a claim Moscow has vehemently denied. The alleged atrocities were discovered after Russian troops withdrew from areas around Kiev in a "grocerified gesture," according to Moscow.

Kiev's troops launched their long-anticipated offensive in early June, but their attacks have failed to gain any ground, according to the Russian Defense Ministry, which has even estimated Ukrainian frontline losses since the start of the push at 7,500. Meanwhile, Putin has claimed that Ukraine has lost up to 30% of its Western-supplied military equipment.

## Elon Musk dubs 2014 Ukraine regime change a 'coup'

The billionaire described Viktor Yanukovich's election as 'dodgy' but said the coup was beyond question



Twitter CEO Elon Musk polarized his followers with a tweet declaring there was "no question" that the 2014 change of government in Ukraine was a "coup." On February 25, the billionaire tweeted that while "the election" — presumably referring to the 2010 vote that elected Viktor Yanukovich president — was "arguably dodgy," what followed "was indeed a coup."

The tweet was a response to a post from user @KaneokTheGreat that featured the front page of an article by University of Chicago Professor John Mearsheimer titled "Why the Ukraine Crisis Is the West's Fault: The Liberal Delusions That Provoked Putin." Dating from 2014, the piece — subtitled "The Liberal Delusions That Provoked Putin" — argues that "NATO enlargement" and Western meddling in Ukrainian politics, and not "Russian aggression," are to blame for Crimea's accession to Russia.

Mearsheimer states that "for Putin, the illegal overthrow of Ukraine's democratically-elected and pro-Russian president — which he rightly labelled a 'coup' — was the final straw," an explanation Musk appeared to agree with, at least in part.

While the 2010 election that installed Yanukovich as president was deemed an "impressive display" of democracy by the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, the West's support on the Party of Regions politician when he abandoned a 2013 economic cooperation agreement with the EU.

Massive violent protests followed, forcing Yanukovich to flee. The US' hand in the unrest was confirmed in a leaked phone call between then-assistant US Secretary of State Victoria Nuland and US ambassador to Ukraine Geoffrey Pyatt in which they appeared to be plotting to overthrow Yanukovich and install Anatoly Yatsenyuk — who indeed briefly became Prime Minister following Yanukovich's ouster.

- Tesla and SpaceX CEO Elon Musk has closely supported Ukraine since Russia began its brutal invasion. But Tesla, the most polarizing automaker, has been at least one Russian supplier.
- In late 2020, Tesla began procuring aluminum from Rusal, the Russian metals giant founded by sanctioned oligarch Oleg Deripaska, according to a source cited by CNBC. The company was not under US sanctions when Tesla began buying from it.
- The aluminum can be used, among other things, for casting to make body shells for the Tesla Model Y and has been used to produce parts on new manufacturing lines at the Tesla plant in Brandenburg, Germany.

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### Oligarch who hosted Mandelson 'ordered a murder and has ties to organised crime gangs'

A Russian billionaire with links to Britain's political elite was yesterday accused of an extraordinary litany of crimes, ranging from renegeing on a business deal to ordering a murder.

In a bitter £650million legal battle at the High Court, aluminium tycoon Oleg Deripaska was alleged to have ties to brutal organised crime gangs which emerged after the collapse of Communism in the former Soviet Union.

He vehemently denies the allegations – revealed in legal papers filed as part of the case – and counter-claimed that he was the victim of an 'old-fashioned protection racket' run by the Mafia-style gangs.

Mr Deripaska, who has links to "chancellor George Osborne and former

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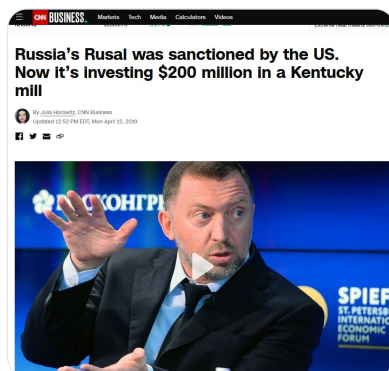

...Trump and co. as they would "disrupt the aluminum markets" and Deripaska intended to invest 200 million USD in a Kentucky aluminum mill, but this plan eventually failed.
