Nationalists rally in Russian town near Chechnya

MOSCOW, June 5 (Reuters) - Hundreds of locals rallied in the town of Stavropol in southern Russia on Tuesday, demanding the eviction of ethnic Chechens, witnesses and media said, reviving memories of racial riots in other parts of the country.

Thousands of people gathered earlier on Tuesday at the funerals of two young Russians killed by unknown attackers on Sunday in the leafy town of some 350,000 residents, 1,700 km (1,060 miles) south of Moscow and bordering volatile Chechnya.

Many people in the town, populated mainly by Slavs, believe Chechens killed the two Russians in revenge for the murder of a Chechen man on May 24 in clashes between local Chechens and Russians.

Hundreds of people gathered in Stavropol's main square, responding to calls in leaflets "to hold a Slav gathering".

Minor scuffles with police erupted, Interfax news agency and Internet newspaper www.gazeta.ru reported. Police detained dozens of rioters after a calm was

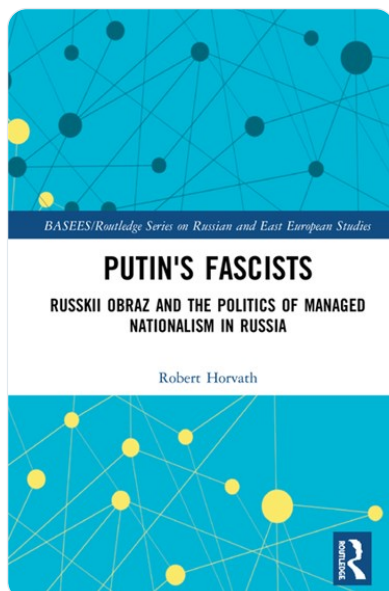

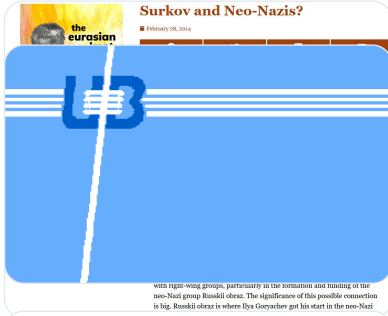

In 2005, Surkov launched a pro-Putin youth movement called "Walking Together", which later collaborated with the most powerful skinhead gang, OB88. To prevent a "color revolution" in Russia, Surkov turned the movement into a powerful group called "Nashi".

 The leaders of the "walking together" and the leaders of the skinheads are one and the same person. Part-time workers lead the branches of the official youth movement and detachments of skins

When I found out about the murder in the market in St. Petersburg. I tried to understand: who are these skins? You remember it was last week. And I went to MUR. The guy who met me there said: "Look, these skins have no organization, and all this is just a hooligan. We eat melon, smog outside the window, cars flash by."



And suddenly the guy says to me:
 "You know, but in Tsaritsyn everything was organized from outside. From the side. And where is this side? Why does some mysterious "party" always declare itself in my country?"
 "In Tsaritsyn," my interlocutor says, "they prepared fittings in advance. These scumbags were paid, they were called to the shooter. Serge, don't get involved in this business. Well, what can you find?"
 But I dug.



Nashi recruited underground neo-Nazi gang members, football hooligans and other low-life scum into their ranks. The organization later separated into two neo-Nazi groups, "Young Russia" and "Locals" that became the link between Russia's far-right and the Kremlin.

Around the same time, the Kremlin tried to fabricate a "neo-Nazi"/Banderite problem in Ukraine with the help of Putin's friend Viktor Medvedchuk. Medvedchuk paid pro-Russian agitator Eduard Kovalenko to act as a neo-Nazi supporter of Viktor Yushchenko:

Then, during the 2004 election Medvedchuk paid Kovalenko a "huge amount of money" so that he would organize a march supporting Yushchenko (against his wishes). This march included Nazi flags and far-right symbols, and Eduard even did a nazi salute during his speech.

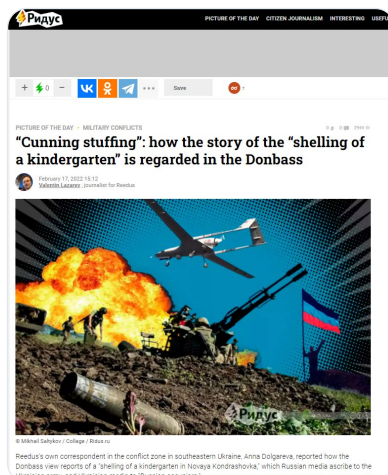
Around 2008 Aleksei Navalny tried to mobilize democrats and radical nationalists against Putin. Putin then sent his own neo-Nazi thugs, "Russkii Obraz" (RO), against Navalny's thugs. RO Nazis were also responsible for the killings of journalists and human rights lawyers.

Once Russkii Obraz was dissolved, its veteran members became powerful figures in Putin's regime, including Anna Trigga who worked for Yevgeny Prigozhin's troll farm, and Andrei Gulyutin, editor of the pro-Putin nationalist blog Ridus.

The domestic Nazi problem in Russia was extremely serious in the early 2000s & it's worth noting that between 2000 and 2017, far-right political violence in Russia was 7 times higher than in Western Europe. "Managed nationalism" was just an attempt to redirect this violence.

Far-right activists & neo-Nazis often take part in military conflicts & that was also the case with the war in Ukraine. The best-known far-right, neo-Nazi paramilitary groups in Ukraine are PMC Wagner and its subgroup, Rusich Group. Both of them participate in the conflict.

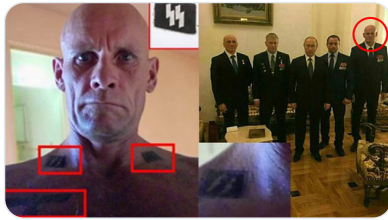

The former was found by Yevgeny Prigozhin and neo-Nazi Dmitry Utkin, who were key players in the 2023 mutiny against Putin. Rusich is led by Aleksei Milchakov, a self-proclaimed neo-Nazi who's committed numerous war crimes:

Rusich's symbol is the Sonnenrad, an ancient European symbol hijacked by neo-Nazis and other far-right groups. You might have seen the symbol in fan-made promotional video for DeSantis' presidency - the one that was also shared by his campaign staffer @njhochman.

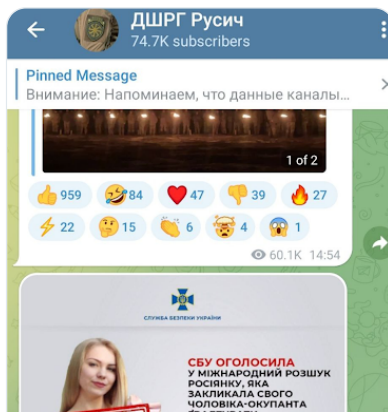
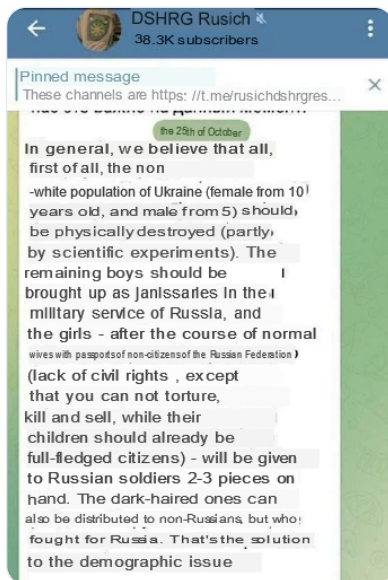
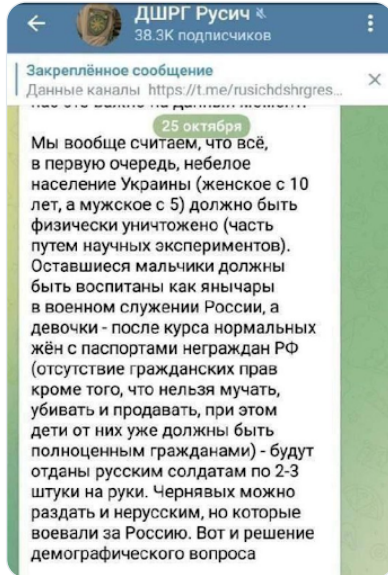
Rusich has expressed genocidal intentions towards Ukrainians by discussing on how to "solve the Ukrainian question", how to exterminate Ukrainian children with scientific experiments, and how to force Ukrainian women serve as concubines to Russian men.

They even called for Russian soldiers to be "given 2-3 girls aged 10 or below" as sexual slaves. They've also stated that "Ukrainian women dream about being raped by Russian soldiers", and that raping them is an "act of charity".

Another prominent but not so well-known Russian, ultra-nationalist organization is the Russian Imperial Movement (RIM). The group promotes "political orthodoxy" and are in a symbiotic state with the Kremlin as long as they don't commit domestic terrorism, ...

...they're free to offer troops and train militants abroad. RIM has been connected to Russian intelligence, and they've provided paramilitary training to extreme far-right militias at least in the US, Poland, Finland, Germany and Sweden.

Of course there are other, smaller Russian neo-Nazi groups fighting in Ukraine, too. Some of these include the Russian Orthodox Army, Slavic Union, Black Hundreds, Dugin's Eurasian Youth Union, and Somali and Sparta battalions.

Mikhail “Givi” Tolstykh and Arseny “Motorola” Pavlov

Colonels in the DNR army, Givi and Motorola are examples of the Donetsk “success story” — they appear on DNR postage stamps, and are even part of local school life. They command the Somali and Sparta battalions, which, with their increased training, are considered elite units in the DNR.

Pavlov, 33, is originally from Ukhta in Russia's Komi Republic. He served in the marines, and did two tours in Chechnya. He likes to pose for journalists, but his biography isn't completely clear: according to Pavlov, he worked as a stone mason before the war, though there's also stories to suggest that he worked at a car wash, and was even convicted for car theft while drunk.

Angered by the events of Maidan, in March 2014 Pavlov travelled to Kharkiv, where he participated in pro-Russian protests. Despite several shootouts and mass street brawls, Kharkiv avoided being dragged into the conflict. Pavlov then joined Strelkov's brigade in Slovyansk.

Both Tolstykh and Pavlov fought in Slovyansk, Ilovaysk, Donetsk airport, Debaltseve and other battles in eastern Ukraine. The Sparta battalion, commanded by Pavlov, flies the Russian imperial tricolour on the battlefield.

Many of these groups have been involved in some form in the Russo-Ukrainian War since 2014 and many of them were integrated into the pro-Russian separatists in Donbas.

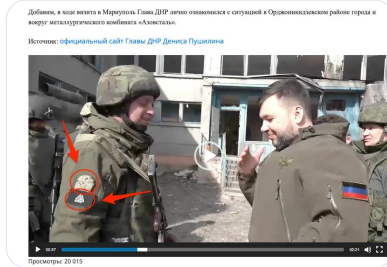

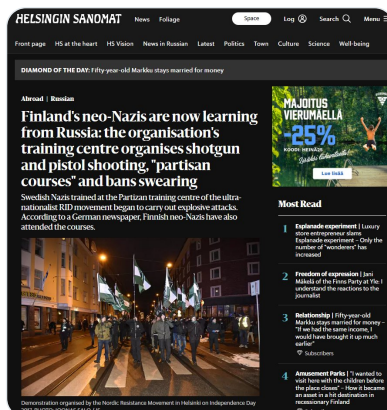
The Kremlin uses Nazism, far-right militias and Nazi propaganda in extremely cynical ways, including:

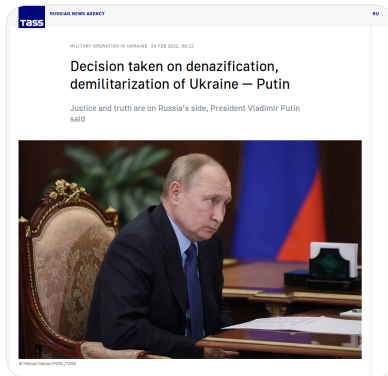
1) using it domestically to control and attack the opposition. They have no problem in dealing with neo-Nazis when they can be used as a tool in domestic politics, 2) training foreign fringe militias and extremist groups that can then incite violence and unrest, ...

3) blaming others for "Nazism" and using it as casus belli. This is what they did in Ukraine,
4) funding of far-right politics and politicians in Europe, and 5) using Nazism as a domestic
propaganda tool. Putin still promotes USSR/Russia as the savior against evil Nazism.

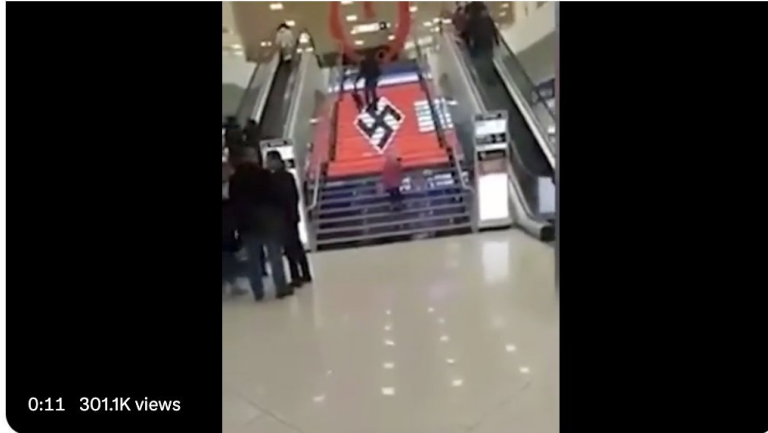
