

In today's #vatniksoup, I'll introduce an American politician and lawyer Mike Johnson (@SpeakerJohnson). He's best-known for acting as the speaker of the US House of Representatives, blocking further US military aid to Ukraine & for his ultra-religious worldview.

Johnson is an extremely religious person, and one of his main missions is to end the separation of church and state. He's cited pseudo-historian and Christian nationalist David Barton as "profoundly influential in his faith and thinking."





But many professional historians dismiss Mr. Barton, whose academic degree is in Christian education from Oral Roberts University, as a biased amateur who cherry-picks quotes from history and the Bible.

"The problem with David Barton is that there's a lot of truth in what he says," said Derek H. Davis, director of church-state studies at Baylor University, a Baptist institution in Waco, Tex. "But the end product is a lot of distortions, half-truths and twisted history."

As a boy, Mike dreamed of becoming a firefighter like his father, but became a vampir... lawyer instead. He acted as a constitutional lawyer before entering politics, supporting and promoting sodomy laws that would've criminalized homosexuality.

At the time, Johnson was an attorney and spokesman for Alliance Defense Fund, known today as Alliance Defending Freedom, where he also authored his opposition to the Supreme Court ruling in Lawrence v. Texas – which overturned state laws that criminalized homosexual activity between consenting adults.

ADF wrote an amicus brief in the case which supported maintaining criminalization.

"States have many legitimate grounds to proscribe same-sex deviate sexual intercourse," Johnson wrote in a July 2003 op-ed, calling it a public health concern.

"By closing these bedroom doors, they have opened a Pandora's box," he added.

Johnson is a long-time and outspoken critic of LGBT rights. He's said that gays "are capable of changing their abnormal lifestyles" and that "homosexual marriage is the dark harbinger of chaos and sexual anarchy that could doom even the strongest republic."

In the mid-2000s, Johnson's anti-gay rhetoric was harsh. In September 2004, Johnson wrote in support of a Louisiana amendment banning same-sex marriage saying it could lead to people marrying their pets.

"Homosexual relationships are inherently unnatural and, the studies clearly show, are ultimately harmful and costly for everyone," he wrote. "Society cannot give its stamp of approval to such a dangerous lifestyle. If we change marriage for this tiny, modern minority, we will have to do it for every deviant group. Polygamists, polyamorists, pedophiles, and others will be next in line to claim equal protection. They already are. There will be no legal basis to deny a bisexual the right to marry a partner of each sex, or a person to marry his pet."


Johnson added that allowing same-sex marriage could be the downfall of the democratic system.

"The state and its citizens have a compelling interest in preserving the integrity of the marital union by making opposite-sex marriage the exclusive form of family relationship endorsed by the government," he wrote. "Loss of this status will deemphasize the importance of traditional marriage to society, weaken it, and place our entire democratic system in jeopardy by eroding its foundation."

Same-sex marriage must be opposed

Though some may have missed it, this month has marked the culmination of the culture

war's "perfect storm." While four extremist judges on the Massachusetts Supreme Court have demanded that their state law be changed to allow legally sanctioned samesex marriage, San Francisco's mayor has engaged in outright anarchy by ignoring California's existing

In the end, the family as we know it may hinge on the passage a federal marriage amendment. Let us hope that lawmakers everywhere have the wisdom and courage to do what is right for us all.

Johnson is taking his Christian duties so seriously, that, together with his 17-year old son, he's even installed a porn detection software called Covenant Eyes on his devices.







Mike is also a young-earth creationist, believing that the Earth is 6000 years old. He helped the Creation Museum secure millions in tax subsidies to build a theme park where dinosaurs accompanied Noah in his ark. He's also connected evolution to mass shootings.



That was quite an indictment: the United States as a godless nation and a moral wreck. But Johnson meant it. He continued: "We've taught a whole generation, a couple of generations now, that there is no right or wrong, that it's about the survival of the fittest, and you evolved from the primordial slime." One result, he claimed, was school shootings. Yes, the teaching of evolution has led to these bloody massacres.

In 2010, he was named the "founding Dean" of the Pressler School of Law in Lousiana. Supposed to become a "bastion of ardent theological and political conservatism," the school never opened despite millions in funding, and Johnson eventually resigned from his position.

Those living near wind turbines also have to endure <u>noise and shadow flicker</u> caused by the turbines. It is unfair to ask rural residents to endure the brunt of inconveniences required for renewable energy generation in order to provide electricity to those in urban areas. And residents of these rural areas are beginning to resist in <u>San Bernardino</u>, California, and <u>Erie, Orleans and Niagara</u>, New York. San Bernardino has even <u>banned</u> energy projects that would serve mostly out-of-town utility customers.

A good example of how Johnson's faith affects his approach to public policy occurred earlier in this seminar, when he discussed climate change. He asserted that the demand for action to address the climate crisis "defies the created order of how this is all supposed to work." He explained that the Bible presents an order to life: There's God, beneath God is "man," and below that all the animals. Humans are to follow God's command to "take dominion of the Earth. You subdue it...We're supposed to eat those animals."

Like a good Christian, Mikey has opposed universal healthcare, refugee assistance and raise of the minimum wage to 15 USD. Understanding the power of thoughts and prayers during disasters, he's applauded Lousiana's efforts to add more religious stuff in schools.

But after Trump became the President, Johnson, like so many others, was politically cuckolded by Trump. He later served in Trump's legal defense team during both of his impeachment trials. Today as the speaker, he's basically doing what Trump tells him to do.

As the vice chairman of the House Republican Conference, Johnson is something of an establishment candidate. He's also a senior member of the House Judiciary Committee, which Rep. Jim Jordan, the conference's previous nominee, chairs.


But Johnson also has conservative bonafides, having previously chaired the House Republican Study Committee.

In his letter to colleagues asking for support, Johnson highlighted the national debt, border security, crime and inflation as major issues.

An attorney, Johnson was on Trump's defense team for the former president's Senate impeachment trials in 2019 and 2020.

How he's voted:

- Certifying the 2020 election: No
- Sept. 30 continuing resolution to keep government open: No
- Sept. 28 Ukraine aid bill: No




He was also one of the most vocal supporters of Trump after the 2020 US presidential election. In Nov 2020, he said that "the allegations about these voting machines, some of them being rigged with this software by Dominion, there's a lot of merit to that."

In 2020, Mr. Johnson embraced Mr. Trump's wild and false claims of fraud. In a radio interview, he asserted that a software system used for voting was "suspect because it came from Hugo Chávez's Venezuela."


Mr. Johnson also falsely claimed the election was "rigged."

"You know the allegations about these voting machines, some of them being rigged with this software by Dominion, there's a lot of merit to that," Mr. Johnson said.

No credible evidence has ever emerged to support the conspiracy theories about Dominion and another voting machine firm having helped to ensure Mr. Trump's defeat. In April, Fox News agreed to pay \$787.5 million to settle a defamation suit by Dominion over reports broadcast by Fox that Dominion machines were susceptible to hacking and had flipped votes from Mr. Trump to Mr. Biden.



Johnson's promised to release 44 000 hours of security footage from the Jan 6 Capitol attack. As of Dec 2023, a total of 162 hours or 0,4% of the total have been published. Maybe the Trump supporters couldn't find what they were looking for and abandoned the project.



According to Republicans for Ukraine, Johnson has been extremely unsupportive of Ukraine - he voted in favor of only once for Lend-Lease Act of 2022. After that, he's voted against every additional assistance for the war-ridden country.

In one of the most cynical speeches ever, Mike stated in Oct 2023 that "We can't allow Vladimir Putin to prevail in Ukraine because I don't believe it would stop there," continuing

that "We're not going to abandon them [Ukraine]."

Yet he is one of the biggest reasons why the Ukraine aid isn't moving forward - In Jan 2024, he opposed a bipartisan, Senate GOP-sponsored package including both border security and aid for Ukraine, Taiwan and Israel.

WASHINGTON – A rare window for bipartisan agreement on border security and foreign aid appeared to be closing as House Republicans insisted on a hard-line GOP border package and balked at additional help for Ukraine.

"I don't think now is the time for comprehensive immigration reform because we know how complicated that is. You can't do that quickly," House Speaker Mike Johnson, R-La., said Wednesday.

After the Senate passed a bill on Ukraine aid in Feb 2024, Johnson said that he has no intention even of allowing a vote to happen on the bill. He also told his fellow Republicans that there is "no rush" to decide on the bill.



Mike Johnson's Campaign Contributions From Company Tied to Russia

In 2018, a group of Russian nationals donated 37 000 USD to Moscow Mike in campaign contributions through a company called American Ethane. The company was controlled almost entirely by three Russian oligarchs, and they were fined a sum of measly 9500 USD for the incident.

One of the men behind the company, Nikolaev, an oligarch with close ties to Russian President <u>Vladimir Putin</u>, was also found to have financially backed Maria Butina, a Russian citizen who lived in Washington D.C. <u>Butina was sentenced to 18 months in prison</u> in 2019 after admitting to acting as an unregistered foreign agent to infiltrate conservative political groups and influence foreign policy to Russia's benefit before and after the 2016 election.

Johnson's former campaign manager, Jason Hebert, previously told *The Advocate* that the campaign returned the money given to them by American Ethane in 2018 once it was "made aware of the situation."

Sharing a subpoena issued as part of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's Russia investigation in 2018, Los Angeles-based attorney Ronald Lebow posted on X (formerly Twitter): "Besides being supportive of the attempted coup, Johnson received money from Russian Oligarchs and was known to Marina Butina, the Russian spy/go between funneling money from Putin to the NRA and Republicans like Johnson."


