

In today's #vatniksoup, I'll talk about the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the Moscow Patriarchate (UOC-MP) and how pro-Kremlin propagandists, oligarchs and lawyers are using its "persecution" as a tool to reduce support for Ukraine and its government.

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In Oct 2023, @tuckercarlson published an episode on Joe Biden "backing the Ukrainian government as it throws priests in jail," in which he interviewed Bob Amsterdam, a lawyer representing the UOC-MP. He was hired by a Russian oligarch, Vadym Novynskyi, for the job.



The case is related to so called Draft Law 8371, a bill that would give Ukrainian authorities power to investigate the connection of religious groups in Ukraine to the Russian Federation and to ban those that have leadership under the control of the Kremlin.



Amsterdam's client, Novynskyi is one of the Russian businessmen who got rich during the early 90s in Russia. He later obtained a Ukrainian citizenship from Viktor Yanukovych & was involved in politics in Yanukovych's Party of Regions & later in anti-Maidan Opposition Bloc.





Novynskyi has been sanctioned by Ukraine (thus, it violates Ukrainian law to be paid by him) and his assets were seized by the Ukrainian authorities for "aiding the aggressor country [Russia]". He is said to be seeking to avoid the sanctions by transferring his assets.

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Chief Executive Officer Julia Kiryanova of Smart Holding, one of the entities which has had some of its assets seized, told Reuters on Friday that the company was transferred on Dec. 1 from Novynskyi to a trust owned by citizens of Cyprus, and was no longer connected to him.


In its statement, the SBU security agency said Novynskyi had tried to avoid the sanctions by transferring his assets to affiliated commercial structures.

Kiryanova dismissed the SBU's assertions as "nonsense" and said Novynskyi had transferred his assets to the trust before the sanctions were put in place.

Novynskyi is also a priest in the Russian Orthodox Church (ROC) of the Holy Resurrection in Zürich, Switzerland (Incidentally, Kirill also worked for the KGB in Switzerland). According

to official records, he also still holds a Russian passport.

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As this rather thick soup has quite a lot of names and abbreviations, here's a handy cheat sheet that you can check whenever you have trouble remember them all:

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UOC-MP = Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the Moscow Patriarchate (Pro-Kremlin)
ROC = Russian Orthodox Church (connected to UOC-MP, the Kremlin
and the Russian intelligence)

Vadym Novynskyi = Russian oligarch, priest of the ROC
Robert Amsterdam = Lawyer hired by Novynskyi to defend UOC-MP

Amsterdam has falsely claimed that UOC-MP has been "completely separated from Moscow in May of last year [2022]". Canonical unity, even subordination of the UOC-MP to the ROC is actually hidden in the UOC-MP's statute and UOC-MP never declared full independence from ROC.

We trust that the Ukrainian Orthodox Church will be governed according to the Divine and sacred canons and the customs of the Cafolitic Orthodox Church and the definitions of this Archaeist Council. We pray with one heart and one mouths the Shepherd of the Lord for the revelation of heavenly help and blessings of the Holy Ukrainian Church.

The Ukrainian Orthodox Church, united through our Russian Orthodox Church with the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, without a conciliar decision of the entire Orthodox Catholic Fullness, but does not change anything about the dogmas of faith and the holy canons.

The Compeable and Almighty Life-Science Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, may always strengthen the Holy Orthodox Ukrainian Church, may she be married by glory and honor, and may she bless her being to save the pious tidy.

On October 28, 1990, Sunday, at the Divine Liturgy in the ancient Cathedral of St. Sophia in Kiev, His Holiness Patriarch Alexy II of Moscow and All Russia handed the Diplomatic to the Metropolitan of Kiev and All Ukraine Filaret.

Actually, there are some priests within the UOC-MP who have been persecuted: a number of UOC-MP priests were banned from liturgies because of their criticism of the church's pro-Kremlin leadership, so they started their own NGO called St. Sophia Brotherhood.


Bob Amsterdam works his fees to perfection.

Our channel's sources in Washington say that there is considerable indignation in Republican circles about the policy of the UOC.

"We are all religious people. We will defend freedom of religion. For us, this is the main value. Religious persecution must stop", - precisely such messages, which are the result of counter-propaganda, are conveyed by Republicans to Ukrainian politicians. And any conversation • of Republicans in the topic of Ukraine now takes place through the prism of the events surrounding the UOC.

In our opinion, the battle for Law 8371 by the Office of the President has been lost. This round, with the support of Amsterdam, was won by Protodeacon Novinsky and the UOC Synod. The Ukrainian authorities underestimated the power and connections of the ecclesiastical-political wing in the UOC. The pressure on the Office of the President and the leadership of the Verkhovna

We predict that there will be no positive vote on Law 8371.



As many of you know, Soviet and Russian intelligence agencies have used the Orthodox Church extensively for intel operations and propaganda, as the West fears harassing churches as it looks like an attack on freedom/democracy. This allows these spies to fly under the radar.







The FBI suspected an employee of the Russian Orthodox Church of recruiting agents for Russian intelligence services in the United States

The US Federal Bureau of Investigation suspected Dmitry Petrovsky, an employee of the Moscow Patriarchate's Department of External Church Relations, of working for Russian intelligence.

The FBI believes that Petrovsky, under the cover of the Russian Orthodox Church, was engaged in recruiting agents for Russian intelligence services among priests and parishioners of the Russian Orthodox Church and other Orthodox churches in the United States.

In May 2021, Petrovsky was searched upon entering the United States. Files related to Russian intelligence were found on his computer. Among the documents found were dossiers on well-known Orthodox priests in the US with details of biographies of their family members. The FBI believed that such information was necessary for Petrovsky to blackmail these people during the recruitment process.

One of the files found was marked "confidential." The FBI cited it in full in its warning. Thus, according to the agency, this document contained a description of the areas of cooperation between the Russian Orthodox Church and the Russian special services - SVR, GRU and FSB.



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While invading Ukraine, Russia has also actively and forcibly closed, seized and investigated most (but not the UOC-MP) Ukrainian religious organizations in the captured regions. Religious leaders are then tortured, killed and/or deported by Russia's intelligence services.



In research on religious repressions conducted by Verstka, since the beginning of the Russian full-scale invasion, 43 instances of the targeted persecution of clergy have been recorded:

"As a result [of Russian persecution], in 18 cases, ministers were forced to flee the city, go underground, or completely cease activity. In 12 cases, they were forcefully expelled. In eight, they were taken prisoner, and in five, killed."59

Ministers were pressured through their families, children, and close ones. It is a known fact that Russians kidnapped a priest's son and held him in a prison cell for weeks to pressure his father regarding his religious activity. $^{60}$ 

When they could not gather enough evidence to charge priests and pastors, the occupation authorities organized open provocations. Weapons and compromising materials implicating them in terrorist activities were planted on church ministers. Russian authorities have used this kind of provocation since the occupation of the Donetsk and Luhansk regions in 2014. For example, a supposed commendation from the Armed Forces of Ukraine, and literature with the alleged signatures of Ukrainian soldiers were planted on one pastor. Such falsified "evidence" has led to the arrest and violent torture of priests and their family members.

"My friend's son was taken prisoner. They beat him and tortured him with electricity. Then they let him go. A part of his body was twisted. When the boy returned home, his father did not even recognize him. He thought that some homeless person was standing in the yard." 62

Also, the idea about "persecuted Christians" probably originated from pro-Kremlin Telegram sources like "Pravblog" and Alex Voznesensky (who's collaborating with Russian intel), who theorized about using religion to attack the Ukrainian government already back in Apr 2023.



In this regard, a question arises. Why don't the affected dioceses of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church send detailed letters about violations of the fundamental rights of believers to Congress? To the same representatives of the Republican Party? Yes, and finally, personally to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Kevin McCarthy? By adding numerous videos of violations and harassment to the letters...

In our opinion, this would be a much more effective move than signing meaningless petitions to the Ukrainian authorities.

In this case, the algorithm for implementing the task may be as follows. Let's take, for example, the most problematic Ivano-Frankivsk and Khmelnytsky dioceses. They can publish the text of a standard appeal to US congressmen on their official websites, and then send corresponding letters from the e-mails of the dioceses to the e-mails of American politicians. Adding to them evidence of violations in video format, screenshots, etc.




A real opportunity to protect the positions of the UOC


Louisiana Congressman Mike Johnson was elected Speaker of the House of Representatives today.

This "persecution" is being pushed not due to religious freedom, but because Russia hopes it will split the Western and US support for Ukraine. The reason the Draft Law 8371 is being considered is that the Russian Orthodox Church is a key tool of influence of the Kremlin.


### American lawyer Amsterdam, representing the interests of the UOC, in the coming days will go to Kiev



The famous American lawyer Robert Amsterdam, who as a lawyer represents the interests of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church from the fall of last year, will go to Kiev in the coming days.

Ukrainian Member of Parliament and oligarch Vadym Novynsky and Andriy Kiseliov whose interests include metallurgy were excluded from Russia's sanctions list on April 20.

As Russia's news agency Interfax reported, Novynsky and Kiseliov were removed from the list of individuals subject to special economic measures of Russia under a decree of the Government of the Russian Federation, signed on April 20 and published on the official portal of legislative acts.

Now Bob, if you were genuinely interested in defending priests against persecution, why haven't you commented on the atrocities the Russian troops have conducted in the temporarily occupied territories since 2014? You know, torture, murder, exile & other inhuman activities.

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In Russia occupied Ukraine, in contrast, there is no religious freedom. All Ukrainian RO's have been forcibly closed, seized, and investigated by Russian intelligence services. Religious leaders and RO members are tortured, killed, imprisoned, and deported. The ROC-MP is the main beneficiary of this situation, absorbing formerly Ukrainian Orthodox congregations as well as buildings of other closed churches. The only option for Ukrainian RO's is to agree to become part of a Russian RO and to align with the Kremlin's views on the war. Few, if any, chose or are able to do so. As is well documented, Russia is engaged in an effort to erase Ukraine as a nation, a genocide. It has committed unspeakable war crimes and human rights violations and seeks to eliminate every trace of Ukrainian sovereignty and even its history, stealing children, art, historical relics, household appliances, farmland, and businesses. If Russia succeeds, all of Ukraine's achievements in religious freedom and democratic institutions will be lost.



Is it because your client is actually a Russian citizen who is working as an active priest in the Russian Orthodox Church? Or because you try to stir things politically in the US by promoting a pro-Kremlin narrative of "religious persecution" in Ukraine? Maybe both?

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
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A little about the "Orthodox" tastes of the #MetropolitanPavlo of UOC-MP
