




Russian antisemitism works on many levels, and their narratives vary depending whether they're targeting a local audience or people in Europe and the US. For example for the latter, Russia attempts to create a false narrative of Ukraine being an antisemitic "Nazi state".





But before diving deeper, let's look at a survey data of Russians in 2023: Nearly 30 million Russians harbour antisemitic attitudes, and 15% of those surveyed believed that "Jews were responsible for most of the world's wars." 38% think that the Jews have...

... "too much power in the business world". There were around 2 million Jews in the USSR, approximately 880,000 of those were based in Russia. Half a million Jews had left the country by the time of its collapse, and by 2021, there were just 83,000 Jews remaining in Russia.


Sleeping anti-Semitism

But even if Russian Jews are not afraid to become victims of aggression, the threat of anti-Semitism as such remains relevant. More than half of the Jews surveyed by the Levada Center (54.4%) consider anti-Semitism a serious or very serious problem. The authors of the study associate this with the presence of so-called passive anti-Semitism in Russia. Its manifestations are concluded in telling each other Jewish anecdotes, a jokingly-ironical call by Jewish names, or claiming each other that you are being behaved like a Jew.

Anti-Semi-Semique sentiments are very often manifested by users on the Internet, sociologists note. Anti-Jewish texts exist in abundance and do not show a tendency to reduce, the report says.

At the same time, the risk of the transition of passive anti-Semitism to an active one remains relevant, according to the Levada Center. The trigger for this can serve as a signal from the authorities, which are recognized as the state, according to the report of the research center. "Jews understand that anti-Semitism is in suppressed forms because at the level of the top government leadership demonstratively pursues a policy of friendly treatment of Jews and Israel, the authors of the study write, citing interviews with Russian Jews. If there is a turnaround to anti-Semitism at the state level, it will immediately lead to its rise on the ground. "State anti-Semitism opens the way for the domestic," warns analysts of the Levada Center.

A group of high-ranking members of Hamas arrived in Moscow on Thursday, meeting with a senior Russian official in what looked like an affront to the West aimed at demonstrating how the Kremlin still holds sway over key players in the bloody conflict in the Middle East.

After Oct 2023, Russia also had a surge in antisemitic attacks. For example, in Oct 2023, Russians attacked Jewish people at the Makhachkala airport. The pogrom was naturally later blamed on "foreign actors", "miscreants" and - you guessed that right - Ukrainians.


By Monday, the state's top political spokespeople added a new dynamic to the story. Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov <u>attributed</u> the violence to "interference from the outside... given the circulation of footage showing the horror of Gaza — the deaths of children, seniors, medics — it's easy for miscreants to manipulate the situation, to provoke and inflame people." Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova chipped in to name the "miscreants" as "the criminal Kiev [sic] regime". In this reading, Russia is under attack by shadowy forces from the outside; violence within Russia must be evidence not of internal problems but of a world conspiring against the country's multiracial harmony.

All this didn't go unnoticed in Israel – prominent politician and Likud member Amir Weitmann blamed Russia for supporting Hamas during an interview on RT, stating that "Russia will pay the price" for "supporting the enemies of Israel".

But at the same time, the Kremlin is actively spreading age old antisemitic tropes and conspiracy theories of "Zionist globalist elites taking over the world". These tropes and stories, like the Protocols of the Elders of the Zion and Golden Billion, originate from Russia.







Russian propaganda employs long-standing anti-Semitic narratives and stereotypes to undermine, threaten, and belittle the accomplishments of Ukrainians. The Russian media frequently disseminates anti-Semitic remarks about Volodymyr Zelenskyy, either accusing him of alliances with the hypothetical "world Jewish government" or, in a contradictory vein, asserting that he is "not a genuine Jew." The tactics and strategies employed by Russian propaganda are consistent, prominently featuring the use of anti-Semitic rhetoric. Below are a few examples.

...the need to "denazify" Ukraine. Putin has called Zelenskyy "a disgrace to the Jewish people", drunk Medvedev stated he'd "lost his Jewish identity", and, when asked about Zelenskyy's Jewish identity, Lavrov even stated that Hitler "had Jewish blood, too".



The current president of this tormented country is a person with certain ethnic roots who have spoken Russian all his life. Moreover, he worked in Russia and received significant funds from Russian sources. Nevertheless, at some point, becoming the head of the state, out of fear of getting another "Maidan" directed against his personal power, completely changed the political and moral orientation. In fact, he abandoned his identity. He began to serve the most bare-faced nationalist forces of Ukraine (which, I must admit, have always been there, but amounted to 5-7 percent of the active population).



Putin even went as far as attempting to diminish the Nazi role in the murder of Jews in Ukraine during the Holocaust, by claiming it was done by the Ukrainians and "Banderites", and that "even the SS troops didn't consider it [the mass killings] possible."



In Russia, the "Zionists" have been vilified by the genocidal Russian philosopher, Alexander Dugin, who claimed that the Crocus Hall attacks could've been "Zionists' revenge" for Russia's position on Gaza, while urging his followers to look for "Mossad's fingerprints".

Shortly after the terrorist <u>attack</u> on the Crocus City Hall outside of Moscow in March, Aleksandr Dugin, the influential Russian ultranationalist ideologue, <u>wrote</u> on his Telegram channel that the real culprit was not ISIS, which had taken responsibility, but "the Zionists." The attack could have been "Zionists' revenge" for Russia's position on Gaza, he wrote, urging his 61,000 followers to look for the fingerprints of the Mossad, whose "close relations with ISIS" are supposedly well-known.

But long before that, Russia's massive disinformation and hybrid operation machinery started spreading antisemitism online to sow unrest and polarize societies in the West. For example, the FSB-controlled SouthFront fake news blog has spread several antisemitic tropes.




In Europe, the Kremlin has complemented these narratives by conducting hybrid operations, such as the antisemitic graffiti campaign in France, further provoking online discussions on "European antisemitism".





As we've seen, the conflict in the Middle-East has polarized even the pro-Kremlin bloc, and this type of division is ideal for any kind of online propaganda and disinformation campaign. Now, it's worth mentioning that the conflict is very real and should be addressed,...



...but the Kremlin is cynically using this dire situation to do what they do best – spreading false narratives and half-truths, thus dividing societies, who instead of focusing on foreign policy issues like the war in Ukraine, resort to infighting.





It's also worth mentioning, that not everything comes from the Kremlin spin doctors. First of all, Iran and the CCP are also very active in spreading disinformation with their massive troll
